PL 10002 - SABG Restore Base Benefits Services

Summary:

This present law adjustment requests an increase in federal funds appropriation for the biennium to match the current award for the Substance Abuse Block Grant (SABG).

Background:

The SABG program's objective is to help plan, implement, and evaluate activities that prevent and treat substance abuse, authorized by section 1921 of Title XIX, Part B, Subpart II and III of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act. SAMHSA's Center for Substance Abuse Treatment's (CSAT) Performance Partnership Branch, in collaboration with the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention's (CSAP) Division of State Programs, administers the SABG.

SABG funds are awarded on a 2-year period. SABG Standard Terms and Reporting Requirements include,

- Primary Prevention strategies, directed at individuals not identified to need treatment, must spend no less than 20%.

The need for this funding is to target populations, such as,

- Pregnant women and women with dependent children
- Intravenous drug users
- Tuberculosis services
- Early intervention services for HIV/AIDS
- Primary prevention services
