Tribal Home and Community Based Services Waiver

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Big Sky Waiver

Medicaid HCBS waiver for the elderly and disabled is commonly referred to as the Big Sky Waiver. This program is authorized in §1915(c) of the Social Security Act which permits a State to furnish an array of services that assist Medicaid members to live in the community and avoid institutionalization.

The State has broad discretion to design its waiver program to address the needs of the waiver's target population.

Waiver services complement and/or supplement services that are available to members through Medicaid State Plan and other federal, state and local programs.

System Building

Developing a tribal waiver is equivalent to building a home and community based service system

- What services does the Tribe already have?
 - Respite, Meals Personal Care, etc.
- Who uses the service?
 - Elderly, Disabled, Tribal Status
- Who provides the service?
 - Tribe, other Medicaid provider, senior center
- Who pays for the service?
 - Medicaid, Tribe, other third parties
- What are the services the Tribe needs?
 - Where are the holes in the system
 - What services due you often get asked for
