

Tribal Waiver Examples

Example 1: Henry is an 84-year-old man who was recently discharged from the hospital and requires some in-home care to continue to live in his home. His needs exceed the hours that can be provided by State Plan personal care services. His needs also include supervision which is not an allowable State Plan service. His home will require some modification to allow him safe access as well as safety in his bathroom. The following are waiver services provided:

- Four hours per week of extended Personal Care and Supervision.
- Three hours per week of Homemaker services (house cleaning, laundry, etc.).
- Non-medical Transportation of 60 miles per week.
- Home Modifications including a walk-in shower, grab bars and a ramp.
- Case Management services (daily).

Example 2: Shannon is a 52-year-old woman that resides with her husband. Due to her disability, her needs include some supplies that are not covered by State Plan Medicaid, nursing care in the home, and some respite care for her husband who provides the bulk of her care (unpaid). She also requires extra nutrition to maintain a healthy weight. The following are waiver services provided:

- Five hours per week of Private Duty Nursing.
- Specialized Medical Equipment and Supplies not covered by State Plan Medicaid.
- Three cases of Ensure per month (two cans per day).
- Seven hours per week of Respite Care to relieve her husband.
- Case Management services (daily).
