9:30 am – 10:30 am Montana Medicaid Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) - Personal, Commercial, and Specialized (Wheelchair Vans)

DPHHS would like to consult on ways to improve the NEMT program. Montana Medicaid covers NEMT for Medicaid members to ensure access to and from scheduled medical services.

Currently:

- Transportation is covered when it is needed to obtain medical services covered by Medicaid,
- Reimbursable mileage is calculated utilizing the closest site of service,
- Prior authorization is required,
- Coverage is limited to the least expensive available mode of transportation,
- Attendant coverage is subject to a medical necessity review,
- Mileage is rounded to the nearest whole mile,
- Mileage reimbursement is only available for loaded miles, and
- Payment is made after the review contractor confirms the appointment was attended.

When considering the situations and questions below, are there potential solutions you feel could benefit the program?

- Under the existing NEMT program, mileage is authorized to the closest site of service (aka nearest provider). For example, if a member lives in Browning and requests transportation to see a specialist in Billings the reimbursable mileage is reduced because there is a specialist in Kalispell. What challenges do your members face because of the closer site of service limitation?
- Authorization for NEMT reimbursement is initiated through a phone call to the Medicaid Transportation Center and must be requested before the appointment. Does the existing authorization process create barriers to access?
- Members and commercial transportation providers are reimbursed after incurring transportation costs. How has this policy impacted you and your members?
- Are there other reoccurring issues or barriers encountered when attempting to utilize the NEMT program?

DPHHS currently administers multiple primary care case management programs. At the request of senior leadership, we have been asked to evaluate a more efficient way to deliver primary care services that meets the unique needs of Montana. The Department is interested in discussing which elements of the current primary care case management programs (Passport to Health, Team Care, PCMH, and CPC+) impact Tribes, Urbans and IHS.

Discussion will include:

- Overview of current Primary Care Programs
 - Passport to Health, Team Care, Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) and Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+);
- Challenges and/or gaps in providing these services;
- Health measurements/outcomes that are currently collected that could be incorporated into a primary care program;
- Current program evaluations that are being implemented; and
- Policy and procedures that may be implemented that would allow for better primary care case management.
