## **Key Points:**

- Heroin-related overdose deaths have increased dramatically in recent years compared to the previous decade. The number of heroin-related overdose deaths increased from an average of three per year in 2008-2017 to over 20 per year, on average, in 2018-2019.<sup>4</sup>
- Approximately 3,800 Montanans aged 12 years and older used heroin in the last year in 2018-2019.<sup>5</sup>
- Montana's criminal violations involving heroin has increased 180%, from 122 in 2015 to 342 in 2019.<sup>3</sup>
