Civil Monetary Penalties Reinvestment

The Center for Medicaid Services Civil Monetary Program (CMP) Reinvestment Projects makes available federal funds (fines) to support creative ideas and innovation that directly impact the quality of life and care of nursing home residents. CMS returns a portion of the funds to the states where the civil monetary penalties (CMPs) are imposed. These funds are reinvested via a grant process to support activities that benefit nursing home residents by improving their quality of care and their quality of life.

Funds may be used for projects supporting activities that benefit nursing home residents or protect and improve their health care. CMP funds may be used for, but not limited to the following:

- Training
- Transition preparation
- Culture change/quality of life
- Quality of care
- Projects supporting resident and family councils
- Resident transition due to facility closure or downsizing

Applying for Funds

*SLTC will open CMP twice per year with applications due on February 28th and August 31st each year with funding awarded in March and October each year.

Process

Senior and Long-Term Care (SLTC) Division must review the application and supporting documents for initial compliance with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) criteria. SLTC will send the application, supporting documentation and recommendation(s) to CMS for final approval. There is no minimum requirement; however, projects cannot exceed three years
