Montana is in the Top Ten of all states and the District of Columbia for supplying supportive policies to grandparents and other kin raising children.

These Supportive Policies Include

43% Percentage of Montana children in foster care being raised by grandparents or other kin.

- Education Consent Law
- Health Care Consent Law
- De Facto Custody
- At least one time-limit exception or extension for TANF funds
- Federal GAP (Guardianship Assistance Program) funds
- Lifespan Respite Care Program

In the United States, do you know....

2.7 million grandparents have the sole responsibility of raising their grandchildren.

42% of grandparents have been raising their grandchildren for more than five years.

58% of grandparents raising grandchildren are in the workforce.

21% of grandparents raising grandchildren live below the poverty line.
