




Montana Child and Family Services Plan: Outcomes

1. Safety Outcomes

Safety Outcome 1: Children are, first and foremost, protected from abuse and neglect.

The Children's Bureau uses two safety-related statewide data indicators which focus on maltreatment of children in foster care and the recurrence of maltreatment. The results provided in the CSFR Round 3 Statewide Data Indicator Workbook released October 10, 2014 by ACF serve as the baseline for Montana's CFSR child and family outcome measures.

Safety Performance Area 1 - Maltreatment in Foster Care: Montana's entry cohort was comprised of 3,276 children placed in foster care in during the twelve-month period from October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013 (FFY2013). These children spent a total of 780,891 days in care and forty-one of them were reported to be maltreated while in care. The reported incidents resulted in a victimization rate of 5.25 per 100,000 days in care for Montana. No statistically significant difference occurred when comparing Montana's 95% interval estimate surrounding the state's risk adjusted relative standardized performance (RSP) rate of 7.23 victimizations per 100,000 days in care (95%CI, 5.37-9.72) compared to the national observed performance of 8.50 victimizations per 100,000 days in care. Montana met this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Safety Performance Area 2 – Recurrence of Maltreatment: Of the 1,357 children who were victims of a substantiated or indicated report of maltreatment during the 12-month reporting period from October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012 (FFY2012), eighty-four children, or 6.2% were victims of another substantiated or indicated maltreatment allegation within twelve months of their initial report. Montana's RSP of 7.9% (95%CI, 6.5%-9.6%) is not statistically different from the national observed performance standard of 9.1%. Montana met this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Permanency Performance Area 1 - Permanency in twelve months for Children Entering Foster Care: Of the 1,067 children who entered foster care in the twelve-month period from April 1, 2011 through March 31, 2012, 36.8% (393 children) were discharged to permanency within twelve months of entering foster care. The adjusted RSP of 34.6% (95%CI, 31.9%-37.3%) was lower than the national performance standard of 40.5%. Montana did not meet this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Permanency Performance Area 2 – Permanency in twelve months for Children in Foster Care twelve to twenty-three Months: Of the 556 children in foster care on the first day of the twelve-month period from April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014, who had been in foster care (in that episode) between twelve and twenty-three months, 40.6% (226 children) were discharged from foster care to permanency within twelve months of the first day of the twelve-month period. The adjusted RSP of 37.8% (95%CI, 34.3%-41.5%) was lower than the national performance standard of 43.6%. Montana did not meet this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Permanency Performance Area 3 – Permanency in Twelve Months for Children in Foster Care Twenty-four Months or more: Of the 524 children in foster care on the first day of the twelve-month period from April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014, who had been in foster care (in that episode) for twenty-four months or more, 30.7% (161 children) were discharged to permanency within twelve months of the first day of the twelve-month period. The adjusted RSP of 24.6% (95%CI, 21.9%-27.4%) was lower than the national performance standard of 30.3%. Montana did not meet this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Permanency Performance Area 4 – Re-entry to Foster Care in Twelve Months: Of the 389 children who entered foster care in the twelve-month period from April 1, 2011 through March 31, 2012 who were discharged within twelve months to reunification, living with a relative(s), or guardianship, 7.2% (28 children) re-entered foster care within twelve months of their discharge. The adjusted RSP of 7.6% (95%CI, 5.5%-10.5%) was not significantly different statistically from the national performance standard of 8.3%. Montana met this national performance standard in its baseline year.

Permanency Performance Area 5 – Placement Stability: Of the 1320 children who entered foster care in the twelve-month period from April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014, the rate of placement moves in foster care was 3.63 per 1,000 days in care. The adjusted RSP of 3.81 moves per 1,000 days in care (95%CI, 3.55-4.10) was not significantly different statistically from the national performance standard of 4.12 moves per 1,000 days in foster care. Montana met this national performance standard in its baseline year.
