

## Summary of Healthy People 2030 Launch: August 18, 2020

**Vision:** A society in which all people can achieve their full potential for health and well-being across the lifespan.

**Mission:** To promote, strengthen, and evaluate the Nation's efforts to improve the health and well-being of all people.

### Key features of HP2030:

- Fewer, more focused objectives. HP2020 had over a thousand and HP2030 has 355.
  - See [what's changed](#) from HP2020 to HP2030 by searching for a HP2020 objective to find its 2030 counterpart.
- Many measures will be directly applicable to the country recovering from COVID-19. See the [customizable list](#) developed by the Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion.
- New objectives to highlight topics like opioids, HIV, and sickle cell disease and a new focus on well-being instead of simply the absence of disease (thinking, feeling, and functioning as a whole).
- Three critical components:
  - The [HP2030 framework](#), which consists of the vision, mission, and overarching goals. (The mission was described as what US HHS is responsible for and the overarching goals as what society needs to do.)
  - [Objectives and data](#) (a set of core objectives, 114 developmental objectives, and 40 research objectives).
  - Evidence-based [tools for action](#) that demonstrate how to achieve objectives.
- A focus on mobilizing all sectors to engage in reaching the HP2030 targets, not just health systems.
- Data for the objectives came from 81 different data systems, and the dashboard will be updated on an as needed basis (more often than it was in the past). Criteria for establishing and evaluating the core objectives included:
  - Does this measure address health equity or disparities?
  - Does it have baseline data no older than 2015?
  - Are we sure that at least two additional data points will become available in the next decade?
  - Is it informed by an approved data source (federal, publicly available, and nationally representative)?
- Ability to build a customizable list of objectives to follow for your organization's use that comes with a unique URL to share with your partners.

Additional tools will be added to the website in the coming months and years, including assessments, a midcourse report and a more comprehensive database with state-level, subpopulation, and trend data, charting and visualization features, and disparity analyses.
