PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM HOMELESSNESS (PATH) PROGRAM**

What is MT PATH Program?

The MT PATH Program is part of SAMHSA’s Recovery Support Strategic Initiative to reduce or eliminate homelessness for individuals with serious mental illness or co-occurring serious mental illness and substance use disorders. Through its required and elective services, PATH links a vulnerable population who experience persistent and pervasive health disparities to mainstream and other supportive services. Collectively, these efforts help homeless individuals with serious mental illness secure safe and stable housing, improve their health, and live self-directed, purposeful lives.

Who is eligible?

All individuals who have a serious mental illness, or co-occurring serious mental illness and substance use disorder, and is experiencing homelessness or is at imminent risk of becoming homeless. In addition they are deemed ineligible for commercial or public health insurance programs, have formally determined the insurance unaffordable, or for services not sufficiently covered by insurance.

What services are associated with a PATH Program?

- Case management, medication management, and prescription renewal within 3-5 days of enrollment;
- Referral to community behavioral health services, including support services; and
- Referral to primary health and dental services, job training, education services, and housing services;
- Screening and diagnostic treatment services;
- Habilitation and rehabilitation services;
- Community behavioral health services, including support services;
- Primary health services, job training, education services, and housing services;
- Substance use disorder treatment services; and
- Supportive residential services.
