GENERAL RULE— Use the following standards to determine financial eligibility for Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB) coverage:

► RESOURCES Effective March 1, 2015, use the following resource standards to determine resource eligibility for Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB) coverage:

- Individual..... \$7,280
- Couple\$10,930

► INCOME Effective March 1, 2015, use the following standards to determine income eligibility for Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB) coverage:

- Individual..... Between \$981.01 and \$1177.00
- Couple..... Between \$1328.01 and \$1593.00

NOTE: In years in which there is an SSA COLA increase, on-going recipients' SSA COLA increases are disregarded when received until the new benefit standard is implemented for that year. These clients are entitled to receive continuous benefits until the new income limits are published. The system handles this disregard automatically.

APPLICATION Effective 1/1/2010, applications for Social Security Extra Help are considered applications for Medicare Savings Programs. Medicare beneficiaries may also apply for Medicare Savings Programs through the traditional application process at any Office of Public Assistance. The State will be notified electronically of applications received by Social Security for Extra Help. These applications will be processed after that notification. Verification and documentation must still be requested and received by the Department according to established application processing policies outlined in this manual.

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
