


Figure 1. Human cases of West Nile Virus infection by onset date – Montana, 2013

Figure 2. Montana Public Health Laboratory mosquito pool testing results – Montana, 2013




Figure 3. Confirmed and probable human cases of West Nile Virus – Montana, 2013
