Why is there a need for Naloxone Master Trainers?

In response to the opioid epidemic, HB333 was passed into law as the Help Save Lives from Overdose Act. This Act extends liability protections to public safety, firefighters, and school nurses when administering Naloxone to a suspected overdose in the course of their duties.

Naloxone Master Trainer led training fulfills the DPHHS approved training requirement of the Act.



DPHHS has contracted with Best Practice Medicine to provide Naloxone Master Trainer courses.

The goal of Master Trainers is to TEACH others to administer Naloxone.




