


MOTOR VEHICLE E-CODE DECISION TREE

Is a motor vehicle* involved?



Did the event involve a motor vehicle colliding with a train?

If Yes, use E810

Did the event involve a motor vehicle colliding with a non-motorized vehicle such as a bicycle, a person riding an animal, an animal-drawn vehicle, or a streetcar?

If Yes, use E813

Did the event involve a motor vehicle colliding with a pedestrian (includes people using rollerskates, non-motorized scooters, skateboards, skis, non-motorized wheelchairs)?

If Yes, use E814

Did the event involve a single motor vehicle?

Did the motor vehicle collide with something on the highway such as an abutment, animal, guardrail, boundary fence, median, other object, etc. (anything other than another motor vehicle)? If Yes, use E815

Did the motor vehicle lose control or rollover (didn't hit anything)? If Yes, use E816

Did someone get hurt while trying to get into or out of the motor vehicle while it was on a street, highway or public roadway? If Yes, use E817

Did the event involve some other non-collision scenario (being accidentally pushed from a moving vehicle, being hit by an object thrown in to or on a moving motor vehicle, a fire starting in a moving motor vehicle, etc.)? If Yes, use E818

If the details of the incident are unknown, use E819


Did the event involve two or more motor vehicles?

Did one motor vehicle leave the roadway, come back on to the roadway and then strike another moving motor vehicle? If Yes, use E811

For all other events that do not involve re-entry but do involve a collision between two motor vehicles (head-on, rear-end, T-bone, hitting a parked car), use E812

*A motor vehicle is any mechanically or electrically powered device, not operated on rails, upon which any person or property can be transported upon a highway. Includes automobile, bus, truck, motorcycle, motorized bicycle (moped) or motorized scooter, motorized wheelchair, trolley not on rails, van, off-road vehicle, ATV, snowmobile, tank, etc.

MOTOR VEHICLE E-CODE DECISION TREE




Reminder: For E810-E819 and E820-E825 codes, please be sure to include the 4th digit to identify the injured person:

NON-MOTOR VEHICLE E-CODE DECISION TREE



Reminder: For E826-E829 codes, please be sure to include the 4th digit to identify the injured person:

.0 = Pedestrian	.4 = Occupant of streetcar
.1 = Pedal cyclist	.8 = Other specified person
.2 = Rider of an animal	.9 = Unspecified person
.3 = Occupant of an animal-drawn vehicle	

*A non-motor vehicle is any device, except a motor vehicle, in, on, or by which any person or property may be transported on a roadway. Includes an animal carrying a person or goods, animal-drawn vehicles, bicycle or other pedal cycle, and streetcar (running on rails).

FALLS E-CODE DECISION TREE

What is the sequence of the fall event?

What is the sequence of the falls event?

Person fell, then struck/hit something

Person accidentally struck another person or object, then fell

Person was accidentally struck by another person or object, then fell

Person fell
See page 1

Fell and **struck a sharp object** E888.0
 Include the appropriate E920 code to identify the specific type of sharp object.

Fell and **struck a non-sharp object** E888.1
 Examples include:
 Fell skiing and hit a tree
 Fell and hit the coffee table
 Fell in the bathroom and hit the tub

If the person was skiing/snowboarding when he/she fell include E885.3 or E885.4.

Fall on the same level from collision, pushing or shoving by or with another person E886

In sports E886.0
 Examples include:
 Two skiers colliding
 Tackled in sports

Other and unspecified E886.1

Crushed or pushed by a crowd or human stampede E917.6

Fall resulting from being struck by or striking an object

In sports E917.5
 Examples include:
 Struck by a baseball, then fell
 Knocked down while boxing
 Ran into goalpost then fell

Striking furniture with subsequent fall E917.7

Striking other stationary object with subsequent fall E917.8
 Example: Hit a tree while skiing and then fell.

Other striking against something with subsequent fall E917.9
