

Montana Maternal and Child Health Block Grant - Summary Descriptions and Data Sources*
National and State Performance Measures for Fiscal Years 2016 – 2020
County Public Health Department (CPHD) Options**

NPM 2 - Low-Risk Cesarean Deliveries: Percent of cesarean deliveries among low-risk first births. (Birth Certificates)

NPM 4 – Breastfeeding:** A) Percent of infants who are ever breastfed and B) Percent of infants breastfed exclusively through 6 months. (NIS)

NPM 5 - Safe Sleep: Percent of infants placed to sleep on their backs. (PRAMS)

NPM 7 - Child Injuries: Rate of injury-related hospital admissions per population ages 0 – 19 years. (SID)

NPM 10 - Adolescent Preventive Care: Percent of adolescents with a preventive services visit in the last year. (NSCH)

NPM 12 -Transition Services: Percent of children with and without special health care needs who received services necessary to make transitions to adult health care. (NSCH)

NPM 13 - Oral Health: A) Percent of women who had dental visit during pregnancy and B) Percent of infants and children, ages 1 – 17 years, who had a preventive dental visit in the last year. (PRAMS for pregnant women, and NSCH)

NPM 14 - Pregnancy and Household Smoking:** A) Percent of women who smoke during pregnancy and B) Percent of children who live in households where someone smokes. (integration of NVSS and NSCH)

SPM 1 - Access to Care and Public Health Services:** Number of clients ages 0 – 21, and women ages 22 – 44 who are served by public health departments in counties with a corresponding population of 2,000 or less. (CPHD reports on state provided form.)

SPM 2 – Family Support and Health Education:** Number of clients ages 0 – 21, and women ages 22 – 44 who are assessed for social service and health education needs; and then are placed into a referral and follow-up system, or provided with health education as needed. (CPHD reports on state provided form)

SPM 3 – Immunization:** a) Percent of 19 to 35 month olds who have received full schedule of age appropriate immunizations against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Haemophilus Influenza Type B, Hepatitis B, Varicella, and Pneumococcal and b) Percent of 13-17 year olds who have received age appropriate adolescent immunizations against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, meningococcal, and Human Papillomavirus. (imMTrax)

SPM 4 – Medical Home: percent of CYSHCN ages 0 – 18 who have a medical home. (NSCH)

SPM 5 - Teen Pregnancy Prevention:** Rate of birth for girls ages 15 - 17 years. (MT Vital Statistics)

*BRFSS – Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System

HRSA – Health Resources and Services Administration

NIS – CDC's National Immunization Survey

PRAMS – Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System (MT does not have this source available)

NSCH – Nat'l Survey of Children's Health (starting 2017 annually, until then 2011 – 2012 NSCH as baseline)

SID – State Hospital Discharge data in the State Inpatient Databases

NVSS – National Vital Statistics System

imMTrax – Montana's Immunization Information System

LHD – Local Health Department
