

FICMMR WebEx Meeting - June 22, 2016 (9-10 am)
MINUTES

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- **NEW DUE DATE:**
Kari reminded everyone that all 2015 deaths are due November 30, 2016
- **CONCRETE, SPECIFIC PREVENTION RECOMMENDATIONS**
When deaths are deemed preventable as of April 1, 2016 all CDR cases after April 1, 2016 need to have specific recommendations/initiatives as we worked on at the March training.
- **Web-based CDR new version 4.1 was launched June 20**
A minor upgrade. Unfinished cases transfer over, no new passwords needed. Autopsy section simplified and other small additions.
- **Promising Pregnancy Care Training July 21-22, 2016 in Havre**
Ann sent out the link to the Promising Pregnancy Care website and asked for help in passing this opportunity on to any professional staff that provide direct OB care especially to our Native American population. * Promising Pregnancy Care is an evidence-based health care delivery system that combines prenatal visit with group education and elements of The Coming of the Blessing. It is a new Medicaid reimbursable model once curriculum is approved.
- **Out of state deaths**
FICMMR leaders need to make an effort to obtain death certificates on your residents who die in another state. Every state has an Office of Vital Records (or similar name) that you go to, to secure the death certificate DC. If you are unable to obtain it after a solid effort, email Kari & she will note this documentation & cease the effort. The data office (OESS) is still short-staffed and can't help us yet in this effort. Stay tuned.
- **Two training opportunities**

- **Montana FICMMR Training Manual**
Kari talked about having to update the FICMMR training manual and asked for volunteers to assist. She will send out an email about what's needed regarding time commitment. The initial draft is due October 15, 2016, final due Dec 30, 2016. The Fetal Death definition will go into the MT Training Manual.
- **CDR:**
 - G. 10 Medical condition- Solely refers to the condition that specifically caused the death
 - **Natural death doesn't mean the death is not preventable refers to an internal medical condition**
EXAMPLE: A family refused to seek help or sought it too late for their child
- **Fetal Death clarification**
Seven fetal death certificates were sent to various counties that shouldn't have been. They didn't qualify as a fetal death. The Criteria for a fetal death is 350 grams **regardless** of what the gestation period is. ONLY if the weight is unknown, then the next criteria slides into place, 20 weeks gestation or higher. Kari will contact those counties.
 - Be sure to input the Date of Delivery/Date of Death on All Fetal Deaths in the CDR.
 - Pls. don't use the fetal death screening tool UNTIL you have rcvd the fetal DC from the state.

- **Suicide Prevention Training Opportunity (via WebEx)**

There is an opportunity for Karl Rosston, the Suicide Prevention Coordinator, to provide a training to FICMMR by WebEx in the fall. Kari asked if there was interest; we need 15 folks to sign up. Correction Update – it is now a 2-hour training – please note. Danica will send out fall dates.

- **County Prevention/Education Initiatives – 3 Counties presented, shared photos**

- 1) LAKE COUNTY FICMMR TEAM – Leigh Estvold & Tammy Matt, RNs, Tammy presented
 - Youth suicides in the past year wanted to bring an expert in to share strategies, resources to get the word out to the community. Brought in the state suicide prevention coordinator, Karl Rosston. He did a great job presenting & we have an OB manager from St. Luke's attend with her daughter who had made an attempt –this lent a powerful dynamic to the presentation. Well attended, good event.
- 2) GALLATIN COUNTY – Tracy Knoedler, Director of Human Resources, FICMMR
 - Lost a young girl who drowned after slipping off a dangerous bank into the river at the Headwater State Park. Mother tried to rescue her daughter, but her other 2 young children followed her into the water and she had to turn around. Tracy has seen a simple box/station at Canyon Ferry that contained a lifesaving buoy used to rescue people in the water. She contacted the park director and he agreed to her idea of creating those stations at the park. He enlisted the help of an Eagle Scout and through community donations; there are now 3 stations at this park. Had a ceremony.
- 3) ROOSEVELT COUNTY – Vickie Bell, Director Public Health Dept, presented; Patty Presser, RN
 - This team organized 2, 3-hour trainings on how to use/conduct the CDC SUID Investigation & Reporting Form when investigating SUID & SIDS deaths.
 - Why this activity? The FICMMR team struggled in obtaining all the information needed from law enforcement when these deaths occurred
 - They secured a trainer, the Hill County Coroner who had attended the actual CDC training
 - The CDC form has questions that need to be answered before an autopsy begins
 - The SUIDI Form guides the process, take you through the important, investigative steps
 - It improves the classification of either a SUID or a SIDS death by standardizing data collection
 - GOAL – hold this training for city, county & tribal officials to be able to implement quality, thorough, consistent investigations to really determine what happened in these deaths and better target our prevention efforts
 - FOLLOW-UP- We need to follow-up with our partners to see if they are using the CDC process
 - Showed a power point that revealed to attendees what an AAP recommended sleep environment should look like, so they could see any red flags when arriving at a scene.
 - In Closing – we want to honor the life of these infants by doing our work well
