MFP

The MFP Participant will receive 365 days of MFP funding and services. Even though the participant is receiving waiver services, they are considered MFP for the 365 days. During the 365 days, the services are fully funded by the Money Follows the Person Demonstration Grant and will not factor into the waiver team budgets.

A person may leave the MFP program briefly. For example, a person may have a short-term hospital stay. If the stay is for 10 days, that time will not count in the 365 day total.

If a person leaves the MFP program for more than 30 days, they will need to re-qualify for MFP and their 365 days of participation will start over.

During the 365 days, the Regional Transition Coordinator will assume their regular case management role and all criteria and requirements of the waiver or 1915(i) program will continue as usual. The MFP program staff will continue to be available to assist as needed and to handle any complaints or grievances from the participant.

The MFP grant comes with reporting requirements to CMS – especially around the three quality measures (risk mitigation/assessment, 24/7 backup, and critical incident reports). The MFP Project Manager will be in close contact with the Regional Transition Coordinator/case manager as needed to complete the regularly scheduled reports.

The second Quality of Life Survey will be completed at approximately 11 months after the participant moves to a community residential setting. *(It is yet to be determined who will complete the second QOL survey).*
