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## Overview

- . \$2,859,649
- <u>Purpose</u>: Provide crisis intervention services, mental and substance use disorder treatment and other related recovery supports for children and adults impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.



## **Eligible Applicants:**

Licensed Mental Health Centers

 State-Approved Substance-Use Disorder Treatment Providers



#### How the grant is structured:

- 70% to individuals with serious mental illness (SMI), substance use disorder (SUD), or co-occurring SMI and SUDs;
- **20%** to individuals with less severe mental health disorders; and
- 10% to healthcare practitioners with mental health needs
  - Allocated separately to the University of Montana
- Both adults and youth may be served by this funding



## What services can be funded?

• Services for individuals who are uninsured, underinsured, or otherwise lack the ability to pay

• Services lacking an existing funding source

PPE for staff—not clients



## What services can be funded?

- **Evidence-based**
- Telehealth accessible
- Wide Scope:
  - Screening and assessment
  - Treatment services
  - Recovery support services
  - Individual support services
    - Crisis services
