The Veterans' ACCESS Act of 2025 (H.R. 740)	ongress.gov/bill/119t
aims to enhance the Department of Veterans h-congress/hou	
Affairs (VA) Community Care Program by	<u> </u>
establishing clear eligibility standards and	
improving access to care for veterans.	
- The bill sets specific eligibility criteria for	
veterans to receive non-VA care, such as if	
the VA cannot schedule an appointment	
within 30 minutes driving time or 20 days for	
primary care, and 60 minutes or 28 days for	
specialty care.	
- It mandates that the VA notify veterans of	
their eligibility for community care and	
provide reasons for any denial of such care.	
- Veterans' preferences, continuity of care,	
and the need for caregivers are to be	
considered in care decisions.	
- The bill requires discussions of telehealth	
options under the Community Care Program.	
- It extends the deadline for healthcare	
providers to submit claims under the prompt	
payment standard.	
- The act introduces a standardized process	
to determine veterans' eligibility for mental	
health treatment programs and seeks
