SDMI HCBS 355	Pain and Symptom Management

Definition

Pain and Symptom Management is defined as a service that allows for the provision of traditional and non-traditional methods of pain management.

Medical Necessity Criteria

- (1) Pain and Symptom Management must be:
 - (a) prescribed by a licensed healthcare professional;
 - (b) necessary to avoid institutionalization; and
 - (c) address functional impairments or other member needs that, if left unaddressed, would prevent member from engaging in everyday community activities.

Provider Requirements

- (1) The provider is required to have an active license or certificate in their specialty and scope of practice as required by state law, administrative rules, and appropriate licensing requirements.
- (2) The provider must be enrolled as a Medicaid provider and have a provider agreement according to ARM 37.85.402.
- (3) Providers may be:
 - (a) hospitals;
 - (b) psychologists;
 - (c) licensed clinical social worker;
 - (d) licensed clinical professional counselors;
 - (e) hypnotists;
 - (f) massage therapists;

- (g) chiropractors;
- (h) acupuncturists; or
- (i) specialized advanced practice registered nurse.

Service Requirements

- (1) Pain and Symptom Management is limited to:
 - (a) acupuncture;
 - (b) reflexology;
 - (c) massage therapy;
 - (d) craniosacral therapy;
 - (e) mind-body therapies such as hypnosis and biofeedback;
 - (f) pain mitigation counseling/coaching;
 - (g) chiropractic therapy; and
 - (h) nursing services by a nurse specializing in pain and symptom management.
- (2) The case management team must:
 - (a) document in the member's Person-Centered Recovery Plan (PCRP) the member's symptoms, complaints, or complications indicating the need for the service;
 - (b) document the members goals, activities, and expected outcomes of the service;
 - (c) monitor, review, and update, as necessary, the PCRP on a quarterly basis;
 - (d) upload the prescription by the appropriately licensed professional in the case management system.
- (3) The provider must complete a progress note for each member receiving Pain and Symptom Management services as required in ARM 37.85.414.

Utilization

(1) Pain and Symptom Management is based on the member's assessed need and are limited to additional services not otherwise covered under Medicaid state plan.
