The Rural Health Transformation Program is a federal funding opportunity that will disperse \$50B to states over five years

- Funding initiative within the One Big Beautiful Bill Act to provide \$50B to states over five years for rural health
- Emphasis on **sustainable, innovative transformation** of rural health in America
- States must submit an application by **November 5, 2025**. The amount of funding Montana receives will depend directly on the quality of this application
- We are therefore working on an expedited timeline to consult with stakeholders and develop our application




The \$50B of RHTP funding will be distributed among States through three components

Distribution of funds

A. Rural facility and population

\$12.5B will be distributed among States based on a pre-determined set of demographic data



B. Technical quality

\$12.5B will be distributed among States based on the contents and quality of their application

Baseline funding

\$25B will be equally distributed among approved States

The RHTP RFI generated a massive response which we have been reviewing in detail

DPHHS received **120+ responses** to the RHTP RFI, including:

- Hospitals and healthcare providers
- Community-based organizations
- Tribal representatives
- Professional associations and universities
- Industry groups

Major themes included:

- Improved **direct healthcare delivery**, workforce training, and behavioral health (BH) integration
- Innovative support models to deliver **wraparound services** such as transportation, job coaching, and community health
- **Culturally-relevant regional cooperation**, workforce development, health programs, and collaboration with Tribes
- Leveraging universities and associations as **conveners** to improve standards, provide training, and support systemic change
- Novel **digital platforms**, telehealth expansion, and data-driven management solutions to improve access and efficiency in healthcare services

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DPHHS is developing a RHTP strategy that aligns with CMS priorities, maximizes potential funding, and addresses Montana's specific needs

Potential initiatives are being evaluated against the following:

CMS priority rural health outcomes¹

- Chronic disease prevention and management
- Increased access to primary care / BH / EMS
- Rural facility financial stability
- Reduction in cost of care
- Increased patient / provider access to data

Factors that will score points for funding

- Population health
- Health and lifestyle
- Rural provider partnerships
- EMS improvements
- Talent recruitment
- Medicaid payment incentives
- Dual-eligible members
- Remote care services
- Data infrastructure
- Consumer-facing tech

Our current rural health priorities

- Healthcare workforce development
- Service delivery model innovations
- Rural provider financial stability
- Population health analytics development

Per CMS, funding MAY NOT be used for new constructions, cosmetic upgrades, or supplanting current funding.

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DPHHS is selecting and developing initiatives that will score highly on the RHTP rubric that will be used for scoring

Criteria	0-4pts	5-9 pts	10-14 pts	15-20 pts
Strategy	Small, incremental changes	Modest changes	Major transformative potential	Structural transformation of rural health delivery
Workplan and Monitoring	Unclear implementation plan	Some level of detail	Clear, feasible workplan; stakeholder roles identified	Detailed, creative; robust governance
Outcomes	Vague, not measurable	Reasonable, specific, measurable	Well-supported, directly linked to outcomes	Ambitious, evidence-backed, transformative
Projected Impact	Limited effect on rural residents	Fair, but unclear substantiation	Significant, clear impact	Statewide, transformative structural change
Sustainability beyond year 5	Not supported or plausible	Somewhat plausible	Plausible with moderate support	Detailed plan or self-sustaining

Total: 100 points across scoring criteria; achieving full points captures maximum weighting of initiative factor
