37.51.301 GENERAL REQUIRMENTS FOR FOSTER PARENTS AND OTHE	ER HOUSEHOL	D MEMBERS
Foster parents must:  Be at least 18 years of age. Be physically, mentally & emotionally competent to care for children. Like and understand children. Be in good general health. Be able to demonstrate sufficient resources to meet the needs of their existing family without relying on the foster care reimbursement. Comply with state laws including those that relate to the possession or use of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, and firearms. Have lived together for at least 24 months unless an exception is granted.  No person residing in or visiting the foster home may pose a risk or threat to the safety and well-being of children in the home.		
☐ A release (DFS-LIC-018) must be completed and submitted to the department for all adults staying in the home for more than two weeks.		
☐ Foster parents shall not provide exposure to sexual or violent language and behavior inappropriate to the foster child's age, including but not limited to visual or other media depictions, and music, while in the foster parents home.

37.51.602 REPORTS OF CHANGE IN COMPOSITION OF HOME	
Foster parents shall notify the Department Licensing Worker or Supervisor (or if operating under a child placing agency, the CPA Licensing Worker):  Within 48 hours if any of the events in 37.51.210 occur.  Within 1 (one) working day of any change in household composition  At least 30 days of a change in employment of a foster parent or a planned move.  If foster parents are unable or unwilling to provide care for a foster child, they shall notify the child's worker or their supervisor immediately.  Foster parents are not authorized to make arrangements for care of a child except for respite care.  A foster parent may not accept placement of any child, including foreign exchange students, Bureau of Indian Affairs or tribal placements without prior notice to and prior approval by the department or the licensed child placing agency under whom the home operates.  A licensing worker will evaluate the new residence for compliance as soon as possible, but not more than 10 (ten) working days after the move to the new residence.	
37.51.1401 REQUIRED TRAINING	
<ul> <li>□ Each applicant shall attend the required pre-service training of not less than eight hours prior to issuance of a regular license.</li> <li>□ The foster parents shall complete the resource parent online training within the first year of licensure.</li> <li>□ Foster parents must obtain a total of at least 15 hours of training annually for re-licensure following the first year of licensure.</li> <li>□ Training must be documented on a form provided by the department.</li> <li>□ Failure to obtain the required annual training hours will result in license restricted to the care of the children in the home at the time until the required training hours have been completed or suspension of current license if no children are placed, until such time as the required training hours have been completed.</li> </ul>	
37.51.305 HEALTH VERIFICATION REQUIREMENTS	
☐ A personal statement of health must be completed for each household member. The forms must be submitted with the initial application, any renewal application and /or any time there is a new household member.	
37.51.306 IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS	
<ul> <li>□ All children residing in the foster home who are under 12 years of a ge must be immunized according to 37.51.306 unless a written and signed statement from a physician that an immunization otherwise required by (1) of this rule is medically contraindicated will exempt a child from those immunization requirements as deemed necessary by the physician, or a notarized affidavit of exemption on religious grounds attesting that receipt of a vaccine or vaccines is contrary to an individual's religious belief, observance, or practice.</li> <li>□ The immunization history must be provided to the department and must include the name of the physician or clinic, the name and birth date of the child, and the date of the immunization.</li> <li>□ A copy of the immunization history must be kept in the foster home in addition to the copy provided to the department by the foster parents.</li> </ul>	

37.51.902 FIRE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS	
<ul> <li>□ Two unobstructed means of exit must exist from all sleeping areas that are and will be occupied by foster children.</li> <li>□ Foster parents shall devise a written plan to exit the home in emergencies.</li> <li>□ The foster parents shall teach the exit plan to children placed in the home.</li> <li>□ The home must have a working smoke detector on each level of the home, in each bedroom, and hallway leading to each bedroom that is properly maintained and regularly tested.</li> <li>□ At least 1 (one) working portable fire extinguisher with a minimum rating of 2A10BC which is mounted and must be readily accessible.</li> <li>□ Extension cords may not be used anywhere in your home as permanent wiring.</li> <li>□ Portable unvented fuel-fired heating devices such as portable kerosene or oil heaters in home are not allowed.</li> <li>□ Fuel burning heat or appliance? □ yes □ no (location) □ Carbon monoxide detector installed □ (location) □ Woodburning or pellet stove, fireplace insert.</li> <li>□ meets □ does not meet building code for installation and use of stove.</li> <li>The department may request an inspection of the stove/ fireplace if a possible concern with safety of either is detected to determine if applicable codes are met.</li> </ul>	
37.51.901 ENVIRONMENTAL AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS	
<ul> <li>Physical construction</li> <li>□ The foster home and its premises must be comparable to other residences in the community and neighborhood in which it is located.</li> <li>□ The home was built or manufactured for full-time residency.</li> <li>□ Every interior door must be designed to permit opening of the locked door from the outside.</li> <li>□ The dwelling must be clean and in good repair, with the premises kept free from objects, materials and conditions which constitute a danger to the occupants.</li> <li>□ Protective plugs installed on electrical outlets if foster care will be provided to children under the age of 5 (five).</li> <li>□ Foster parents shall protect any foster child from any environmental danger or other hazard on the foster care property that the foster parent is aware of and that could affect the health, welfare or safety of children in care. The foster parent must notify the Licensing Worker of any existing concern.</li> <li>□ Cleaning materials, flammable liquids, detergents, aerosol products, and other poisonous and toxic materials must be kept in their original containers or be clearly labeled with both symbols and words indicating that the contents are hazardous.</li> <li>□ Such substances must be kept in a place inaccessible to children and shall be childproofed, if possible, and be used in such a way that will not contaminate play surfaces, food, food preparation areas, or constitute a hazard to the children.</li> </ul>	
Water and sewer	
<ul> <li>☐ Home has adequate and safe sewage disposal system.</li> <li>☐ Water supply is from a municipal system.</li> <li>☐ Water is not from a municipal system, and a basic screen after test has been conducted annually and results provided to the licensing worker.</li> <li>☐ Date basic water test screen completed</li> <li>☐ Water is from an approved source but in a cistern and it is recommended that a basic screen water test be conducted each time the water is replaced, and results provided to the licensing worker.</li> </ul>	

Communication All foster homes shall be equipped with or provide access to a telephone.  Land line telephone Cell phone Telephone numbers of placing a gency, hospital, police department, ambulance, and poison control center must be posted in a place visible to a child in placement.	
Pets  ☐ Pets or animals present at the home with foster parent permission must be vaccinated in accordance with local laws.  ☐ Documentation from a veterinarian that pets or animals at the home are in good health and free of disease must be provided upon request.  Foster parent are responsible for their negligent actions and for any resulting injuries that may be caused by any animal allowed in or around the foster home.	
<ul> <li>Guns and ammunition</li> <li>☐ Guns and ammunition shall be kept in locked storage with guns stored separately from ammunition.</li> <li>☐ Guns kept in vehicles must be locked in the glove compartment or gun rack, must be unloaded, and ammunition must be kept locked in a separate location in the vehicle.</li> </ul>	
Outdoor Play  ☐ Any outdoor play area must be maintained hazard free. ☐ If caring for preschool aged children, any part of the play area adjacent to a well, machinery, road, drainage ditch, holes or other hazardous areas must be enclosed with fencing or a natural barrier to restrict the children from these areas. ☐ Outdoor climbing equipment, such as climbing apparatus, slides, swings and trampolines must be anchored firmly and placed in a safe location. ☐ A responsible adult shall be present and directly observing any activity of a foster child on a trampoline at all times. ☐ Swimming and wading pools, swimming areas and hot tubs must be inaccessible to children except when directly supervised by a responsible adult.	
37.51.1001 TRANSPORTATION	
<ul> <li>□ Foster parents and anyone transporting foster children with the foster parent's permission must possess a valid driver's license and meet the minimum liability insurance coverage required by state law.</li> <li>□ All doors on vehicles must be locked whenever the vehicle is in motion.</li> <li>□ All children must be seated and secured in age-appropriate safety restraints whenever a vehicle is in motion.</li> <li>□ Foster parents must request and receive written authorization before taking any child placed by the Department:</li> <li>□ out of the country</li> <li>□ Foster parents must request and receive written authorization before taking any child placed by the department for more than 72 hours:</li> <li>□ out of the state or □ out of the country</li> </ul>	
Any travel that interferes with visitation, therapy, education or other services provided to a foster child must receive prior approval.	

37.51.801 GENERAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS		
<ul> <li>Foster parents may not accept more children than the number specified on the license without prior approval of the department licensing worker or licensed child placing agency under whose jurisdiction the foster home operates.</li> <li>Foster parents must arrange for appropriate childcare for every child in foster care when the child is not being cared for by a foster parent and is not in school.</li> </ul>		
Foster parent shall provide appropriate care including:		
<ul> <li>Regular, well balanced meals, an adequately maintained and furnished home, clothing, and supervision of child's health and dental care, personal care, supervision, and attention appropriate to each child's age, needs, and level of functioning.</li> <li>Careful and sensible parental decisions that maintain the health, safety, and best interests of a child while at the same time encouraging the emotional and developmental growth of the child.</li> <li>Using this standard when determining whether to allow a child in foster care, under the responsibility of the state, to participate in extracurricular, enrichment, cultural, and/or social activities.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>□ Foster parents are responsible to teach each foster child age-appropriate personal care, hygiene, and grooming, and provide each child with the necessary supplies.</li> <li>□ Money earned by a child or received as a gift or allowance is the child's personal property and must be accounted for separately from foster home funds.</li> <li>□ Foster parents, in conjunction with the supervising worker, shall distinguish between tasks which children are expected to perform as part of living together, jobs to earn spending money, and jobs performed for vocational training.</li> </ul>		
37.51.802 COOPERATION OF FOSTER PARENTS	•	
<ul> <li>□ Foster parents shall cooperate with the placing a gency, implement case decisions made by the department regarding a child and support the department's permanency plan for the child.</li> <li>□ Foster parents must permit and encourage contact and visitation between the foster child and the child's birth or legal family, including parents and siblings, unless a restriction of contact and visitation is part of a court order or written case plan.</li> </ul>		
37.51.805 CHILD'S EDUCATION AND TRAINING		
<ul> <li>□ Foster parents must cooperate with the placing agency, and when appropriate, the birth or legal parents, in providing or arranging an ageappropriate education, employment or training program appropriate for each child that addresses the child's needs in the areas of social living, sex education, consumer education, career planning, and preparation for independent living.</li> <li>□ Foster children must attend public school unless otherwise approved by the department.</li> </ul>		

37.501.806 CHILD'S RELIGIOUS AND CULTURAL EXPRESSION	
<ul> <li>□ Each child in foster care shall have the opportunity to practice his/ her religion.</li> <li>□ Foster parents shall allow each child to attend available religious services of the child's or birth parent's choice in the community and to visit with representatives of the child's faith.</li> <li>□ Foster parents must respect the religious beliefs or practices of children placed in their home.</li> <li>□ Each child shall be given the opportunity to identify with his own cultural heritage and shall be encouraged to do so</li> <li>□ Participation or non-participation in religious activities of the child or foster family shall not be used as a form of discipline.</li> </ul>	
37.51.810 CHILD'S CLOTHING	
<ul> <li>□ Foster parents are responsible to ensure that each child is supplied with his or her own clothing suitable to the child's age and size.</li> <li>□ Clothing must be comparable to the clothing of other children in the community and the household.</li> <li>□ Children must be given appropriate choice in the selection of their clothing.</li> <li>□ Clothing or other possessions that came with the foster child from the child's home must not be disposed of without approval from the child's social worker.</li> <li>□ The foster child's current clothing and other possessions must be sent with the child to any subsequent placement, including a return to the child's home.</li> </ul>	
37.51.815 CHILD'S PRIVACY RIGHTS	
Foster parents are to provide:  ☐ Privacy ☐ Appropriate sleeping arrangements ☐ Separate storage space for clothing and personal articles ☐ A place to display the child's socially appropriate creative works and symbols of identity.	
37.51.816 SLEEPING ARRANGEMENTS AND REQUIREMENTS	
<ul> <li>□ Every child must sleep in a room designated as a bedroom that provides for privacy.</li> <li>□ Any room used as a bedroom for a foster child must have a window which is sufficiently large enough for an adult to enter or exit in an</li> </ul>	

Bunk Beds:	
<ul> <li>☐ More than two bunks high are prohibited.</li> <li>☐ Must have a guard rail on the upper bunk if the bed is used.</li> </ul>	
☐ Upper bunks may not be used by children under 8 years of age.	
☐ Each child must be provided with space in a closet, locker, or dresser for clothing and personal belongings. This storage space must be located in	
the child's sleeping area.	
☐ Children over 24 months of age may not routinely sleep in the same	
room as an adult unless approved by the licensing supervisor.	
☐ When placement in a kinship foster home is determined to be in the child's best interests, an exception to one or more provisions (other than	
safe sleep practices as defined in ARM 37.51.816 8(a)) may be granted	
by the department after careful review of the circumstances.	
☐ Documentation is attached.	
37.51.825 PHYSICAL CARE OF CHILDREN	
Medical	
☐ Foster parents shall work with the placing agency to ensure that the child's medical needs are met.	
□ Every foster child must have an identified physician.	
☐ Medical and dental care, including examinations and treatment, must be	
obtained for children as needed.	
☐ Foster parents, in consultation with the placing agency, are to arrange for an EPSDT (well child) examination within 30 days of placement for	
each child which include medical, dental, vision and hearing screening.	
☐ Subsequent examinations and treatment must be completed as recommended by the child's physician.	
☐ Foster parents must work with the placing agency to ensure that each foster child is immunized in accordance with rules 37.51.306.	
☐ Foster parents shall keep the placing agency apprised of illnesses of the foster child which require medical attention and the results of	
examinations, tests and treatment recommended.	
☐ In an emergency, foster parents are to make arrangements for	
emergency care at a nearby hospital, clinic, or doctor's office, and as	
soon as possible notify the placing agency.  □ Foster parents shall obtain psychiatric, psychological, and counseling services	
for each child when these services are determined to be necessary by the	
placing agency.	
☐ Foster parents may not provide tobacco products in any form to children under the age of 18 who are placed in the foster home.	
☐ Foster parents may not allow children placed in the foster home to be exposed to secondhand smoke in the foster parents' home or vehicle.	
Medication	
☐ Foster parents must keep medication in the original containers, with the original prescription label, in a place inaccessible to children.	
Location:  All medication is to be given as prescribed unless a licensed health care	
provider rescinds the prescription or modifies it and that the foster	
parent will notify the child's worker of any changes in medication.	

<ul> <li>□ Foster parents shall report any threats to the health, welfare, or safety of a child at the time of the license application, or with respect to any threat that subsequently arises, with the next working day after becoming aware of the threat, to the placing worker and the department licensing worker or the licensed child placing agency under whose jurisdiction the foster home operates.</li> <li>□ Foster parents shall complete a written incident report form regarding any serious incident involving any child in the home.</li> </ul>		
37.51.601 CONFIDENTIALITY OF RECORDS AND INFORMATION		
<ul> <li>□ All information in records maintained in your foster home and all personal information pertaining to a child and his/her family must be kept confidential unless there is a court order authorizing release of information.</li> <li>□ Confidentiality requirement continues after a child is no longer in your home.</li> <li>□ The confidentiality requirement applies to information you might learn about another foster child in a support group setting or otherwise.</li> <li>□ Any request for records or information from records maintained in a foster home must be referred to the department or the agency which placed the child and that you do not have authority to release the information.</li> <li>□ All records pertaining to children placed by the department are available at any time to the department or its representatives.</li> <li>□ Records pertaining to children who have not been placed by or in the custody of the department are available for purposes of licensing or relicensing a foster home.</li> </ul>		
37.51.820 YOUTH INDEPENDENT LIVING PROGRAM, JOB TRAINI	<mark>NG AND EMPI</mark>	LOYMENT
<ul> <li>□ If caring for a youth eligible for the department's independent living program, the foster parents must cooperate with the staff and contractors of the program to ensure that eligible youth are encouraged and assisted to access services and benefits offered under the department's independent living program.</li> <li>□ For eligible youths age 14 or older, the foster parents are to assist the independent living program staff and contractors in developing an appropriate transitional plan.</li> <li>□ Foster parents are to encourage and assist each eligible teenage youth in preparing for the transition from foster care to independent living.</li> <li>□ Foster parents are to assist the placing agency, the eligible youth, the independent living program staff, and contractors in: developing the eligible youth's job readiness skills; and when appropriate, assist the eligible youth in locating employment.</li> <li>□ Foster parents shall assist youth in exploring post-secondary educational opportunities.</li> </ul>
