Presentations:

Division Updates

Tracy Moseman, Administrator for the Early Childhood and Family Support Division presented on division updates, recent changes, and upcoming changes.

Preschool Development Grant, Birth to 5 (PDG B-5)

Kathy Rich, Head Start State Collaboration Office, presented on the <u>Preschool Development Grant, Birth to Age 5</u>. This presentation covered a grant application and proposal that would affect the division as a whole, as well as Early Childhood for Montana. This council would be used to help inform and advise the grant work, as well as assist with collaboration with other state agencies, as well as the private sector.

Head Start

Kathy Rich and Ashley Pena-Larsen gave an update on <u>Head Start</u>.

Family and Community Health Bureau

Jacqueline Isaly, Family and Community Health Bureau Chief, gave an update on the Family and Community Health Bureau and each of the programs.

Healthy Montana Families

Leslie Lee, Program Supervisor for Healthy Montana Families, updated the council on home visiting.

Sandy Cade, <u>Early Intervention and Prevention Unit</u> Supervisor, discussed the new section and updated the council on Part C and introduced Joshua Kendrick, the Children's Trust Fund grant manager. Joshua provided the council with an update.

During this meeting, due to the attendance, committees were combined and split into 2 groups. Each group was given questions regarding home visiting and also Part C services. Additionally, the committees were encouraged to review the mission and goal of the work groups.

Expansion and Business Development/Retention and Quality

During this workgroup the following ideas were discussed.

- Marketing work What do we want the outside world to know about our challenges and successes? Promote storytelling efforts amongst providers, families, and others to reach lawmakers and businesses.
- Engage the business community with family friendly work policies that can help working families
- Normalize with leadership the widespread access to mental health supports across programs.
- Explore how work groups can utilize member identified expertise to drive innovation.

Workforce Development/Family Support

During this workgroup, the following ideas were discussed.

- Develop and sustain benefits using the intersection between home visiting and family support.
- Create ideas and assistance with how to prepare parents to be invested in Head Start with their children.
- Look at ways to pay for child care workers child care needs who are ineligible for subsidy.
- Create a tool for parent engagement that includes the natural supports in a child's life.
- Create and use a parent navigator tool that helps families find services they may be eligible for.
- Working families struggle to get kids to Child Find. What can a provider do as a partner in the
 process? How do we get between direct care and the provider? Is there an FSS, speech
 therapist, or other expert that could come in for a variety of reasons to address health and
 development at child care facilities?
- To increase workforce in early childhood careers, start talking to students in middle and high school about the options.

Presentations Continued:

ARPA Funding and Spending Update

Darla Dexter, Special Projects Supervisor, provided an <u>update on ARPA funding</u>, specifically the funding surrounding child care. Stabilization and Innovation grants were discussed. Darla showed the council how to access statewide ARPA funding information using arpa.mt.gov.
