# 2023 Montana Child Care Market Rate Survey

**Final Report** 



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#### **Executive Summary**

#### **Child Care Market Rates**

This section examines changes in statewide and regional child care daily and monthly rates using results from the March and October surveys. The initial child care rate estimates were based on survey data collected in March 2023. However, based on feedback from the March 2023 survey and federal pandemic financial support ending, additional data were collected in October 2023 (post card survey) to assess changes in child care rates from March to October of 2023. If statewide 75<sup>th</sup> percentile rates for March 2023 are used to set Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarship reimbursements, all rates will increase from their 2020 level, except for family daily school rates (Table A). The most substantial increases will be for group home providers, who would see their daily rates increase by 21% to 29%, and monthly rates increase by 17% to 26%. Family and center providers would realize somewhat smaller, but substantial increases by 13% to 26%. Daily rates for family providers will increase by 0% to 14% and monthly rates will increase by 6% to 19%.

The number of respondents was similar for the March (534) and October (468) samples. The March database provided extensive information about provider's business and children in their care and the database was supplemented by information from the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) "advertised daily rates" and daily rates imputed from monthly and weekly data supplied by providers. The October respondents were only asked to report their advertised child care rates and this database was not supplemented by CCUBS rates or any imputations. When comparing the March and October 2023 child care rate estimates, the October 2023 rates were higher, but not


statistically different, than the March estimates. An alternative to the March 2023 state rates proposed in Table A would be to use the October 2023 results for setting state rates.

If statewide 75<sup>th</sup> percentile rates for October 2023 are used to set Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarship reimbursements, all rates will increase from their 2020 level (Table B). The most substantial increases will be for group home providers, who would see their daily rates increase by 36% to 38%, and monthly rates increase by 26% to 37%. Center and family providers would realize somewhat smaller, but substantial increases. Daily rates for center providers will increase by 25% to 38% and monthly rates will increase by 28% to 43%. Daily rates for family providers will increase by 14% to 29% and monthly rates will increase by 16% to 29%.

The regression analysis supports having somewhat higher child care rates for high growth counties, which included Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, and Yellowstone. These high growth counties had population increases of 2,000 people or more from 2000 to 2022 (see Map A).



Map A: High Growth Counties in CCR&R Regions in Montana

The state rates should be the minimal rates available to all providers; however, some premium (additional funding) could be considered for selected high growth counties. Given that the percentage difference between the state rate estimates and high growth county estimates ranges between 5 to 34%; a premium of 15% could be offered to providers located in high growth counties. The rates are reported in Table C, which compares the proposed state rates using March 2023 rates and proposed rates with a 15% premium paid to providers in the high growth counties. If the most current, October 2023, rates were used to set the state rates, then the proposed rates with a 15% premium would be increased to the rates reported in Table D.

Other statistical analyses were performed to assess differences in rural and urban communities, high- and low-income counties, and quality of care (measured by participation in STARS to Quality). The urban communities were Billings, Bozeman, Helena, Kalispell, Missoula, Great Falls, and Butte. As noted above, the high growth counties were Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, and Yellowstone (U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division). The high-growth counties had increased their population by at least 2,000 people between 2020 and 2022. The high-income counties were Jefferson, Gallatin, Stillwater, Valley, Yellowstone, Richland, Lewis and Clark, and Madison. These counties had annual median household income above \$70,000 in 2022 (Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates, 2022).

Using regression analyses, providers in urban communities had similar monthly and daily rates for children in rural communities. Higher income counties had higher daily and monthly child care rates for center providers for infants, toddler, and preschool aged children. And finally, group STARS providers had significantly higher daily child care rates than non-STARS providers for infant, toddlers, and preschool children. These differences in market rates across urban and rural counties, and high- and low-growth and income communities, and STARS providers warrant further review.

#### **Other Analyses**

#### **Business** Policies

In addition to market rates, this study reviewed business policies that impact costs and benefits for providers and parents and billing policies, which can provide an opportunity to examine how state billing policies compare to private pay billing policies. A majority of providers (59% of homes and 71% of centers) charge families for services before care is provided. Centerbased providers are more likely to offer multi-child and employee discounts than home-based providers, and home-based providers are more likely to offer transportation, which benefits parents and is an added cost for providers. A vast majority of providers (87% of homes and 90% of centers) have children who receive the Best Beginnings scholarships. A majority of providers also receive monetary reimbursements for food served through the Child and Adult Care Food Program, and it is somewhat more common for parents to have to providers to receive free or reduced services for the program, such as building space, utilities, volunteer labor and STARS reimbursements, than homes-based providers.

#### Supply and Demand for Child Care

This study aimed to develop an understanding of the supply and demand for child care in the state, and one variable considered was waiting lists. The number of children on full-time waiting lists in both home- and center-based programs suggests that the demand exceeds the supply, especially for infant and toddler care. Fifty percent of home-based providers and 65% of center-based providers have waiting lists for full-time children. One limitation to this assessment is that a child may be on a waiting list for one program while enrolled in another program and a child may be on several waiting lists in a community.

When asked whether they would be more likely to increase or decrease the number of children enrolled in each age group, a greater percentage of providers reported being likely to increase rather than decrease enrollment, which was true for all age groups. And when asked whether they have children with specific characteristics enrolled, only 3% of homes providers and 5% of center providers reported that they did not have any children with the following

characteristics: special needs, experiencing homelessness, low-income, migrants, speak a language other than English in the home, in the care of a relative, or in foster care.

#### Challenges to Business Success

When asked what challenges might make it hard for new programs to open, providers reported: challenges hiring staff (79% of homes and 97% of centers), meeting training requirements (44% of homes and 45% of centers), and high startup costs (53% of homes and 66% of centers).

When asked what challenges might lead to providers closing their programs, over threefourths (75%) of providers reported: feelings of burnout, long work hours, low pay, and challenges keeping qualified staff. Further analysis is needed to more completely explore these challenges to understand what is limiting the supply of child care workers in Montana.

In addition, this study offered providers an opportunity to share what they believe are challenges with the Best Beginning scholarship program and with opening and operating a child care business. Over 40% of home-based and center-based providers reported that reimbursements being paid after care is provided is a challenge with accepting Best Beginnings recipients. Other challenges included low state reimbursement rates (53% of homes and 55% of centers) and limitations on hours covered (45% of homes and 46% of centers).


#### Methods

The child care study utilized a revised version of home- and center-based questionnaires developed by the Child and Family Research Institute at the University of Texas to describe market rates charged by child care providers in Montana. The data collection was handled by the Human Ecology Learning and Problem Solving (HELPS) Lab, located in the Department of Political Science at Montana State University. Seventy-five percent of center-based (190 centers) and 53% of home-based providers (344 family and group child care facilities) completed the initial (March) questionnaires for an overall response rate of 59%. Responses from partially completed surveys were not included in any rate analyses but were included in all other analyses, and the number of respondents included in all additional analyses are noted in each table. A second survey, hereafter called the post card survey, requesting rate information was administered in October of 2023. Based on an updated list of child care providers, the overall response rate for the licensed providers was 57%.

Table E reports the number of respondents by region from the March survey. The largest number of family and group home respondents were from Region 7 (89), while the largest number of center respondents were from Region 4 (53). The accompanying map (Map B) shows the counties included in each region.

The population of interest in this study is child care providers and the children in their child care facilities. The unit of observation in the licensed child care centers is the provider, who reported on the prices charged to groups of children. The units of observation in the registered and licensed child care homes are the provider for standard market rates and the child for actual market rates paid. When considering actual market rates paid, the rate paid by the parents of each child in the family or group child care facility was reported. While a substantial amount of information was collected on all providers and those children in their care, the study is focused on those children who received no discounts or scholarships or were not in Head Start facilities.

The market rate study for 2023 utilized four primary methods to assess changes in child care rates from the previous study in 2020 in the seven regions of Montana. The first method collected full and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged) and these "advertised rates" were supplemented by information from the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) "advertised daily rates" for full and half-days, and hourly and daily rates imputed from monthly and weekly data supplied by these providers in the survey. This supplemented database enabled a more complete assessment of the seven regions in Montana and is the primary method employed to recommend statewide and regional rates. The unit of observation for this method is the provider.

The second method collected full and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged). This method reports only the results from the original March survey without any supplemental information, such as the CCUBS data, or imputations. The unit of observation for this method is the provider.

The third method collected child level market rate information, which was reported by family and group providers for each child in their facility. The unit of observation for this method is the child.

In addition, a fourth method was employed to assess the changes in child care rates between March 2023, when the original survey data was collected, and October 2023, when ARPA Child Care Stabilization (ACCS) funds were no longer paid to child care providers. With the ACCS unavailable, it was anticipated that child care rates paid by parents would increase. The unit of observation for this method is the provider.

Method 1 produced an adequate sample for each child care region to determine if there are statistically significant differences among hourly, daily, weekly, and monthly rates across the seven child care regions. As per the contract with the Early Childhood Services Bureau in the Montana Department of Health and Human Services (DPHHS), the most important statistic for this study is the full-time rate for children not enrolled in the Head Start program, and who are receiving no discounts or other scholarships. This report utilizes 75th percentile rates for each of the age groups.

A Statistical Analysis System (SAS) statistical routine was employed to generate the percentiles and confidence intervals. Using this statistical routine, all means, percentile estimates and confidence intervals were unweighted in provider and child level analyses.

The most important statistic for this study is the rate at the 75th percentile for each of the age groups. Four age groups (infants, toddlers, preschool-aged, and school-aged) are reported in the body of the report. While the study reports the rate at the 75th percentile, it was important to report some measure of the variance. In this instance, confidence intervals are reported for the mean, 50th, 60th, and 75th percentiles. Given that child care rates are not normally distributed, a distribution-free 95% confidence interval is reported for the percentile estimates. These confidence intervals will have different margins of error on the lower bound than the upper bound.

Several other tables are included in the final report. These tables examine additional costs (expenses) and benefits (subsidies and discounts); waiting lists; provider schedules; number of children in care, licensed capacity, and drop-in care; definitions of full-time care; and, other characteristics of home and center-based providers. #### **Child Market Rate Study**

#### Introduction

The Department of Agricultural Economics and Economics at Montana State University has been contracted by the Montana Department of Health and Human Services to conduct the 2023 Montana Child Care Market Rate Survey. This report summarizes the child care market rate data for the entire state of Montana and the seven Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) Regions in Montana. Two types of child care facilities were surveyed between March and November of 2023: Licensed child care centers, registered and licensed homes. Table 1 summarizes the response rates for each facility type for the March and October surveys.

Upon completion of the original survey, 534 of the 903 respondents returned 59% of the questionnaires (Table 1). These 534 questionnaires were divided between the centers (190 for a 75% response rate) and homes (344 for a 53% response rate).

The original survey data was supplemented by rate information reported in the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) database maintained by the Early Childhood Service Bureau and imputations, which converted monthly and weekly rates reported in the survey into hourly and daily rates.

A second survey, hereafter called the post card survey, requesting rate information was administered in October of 2023. Upon completion of this post card survey 468 licensed family (84), group (223), and centers (161) completed the survey. Based on an updated list of child care providers, the overall response rate for the registered and licensed home and center providers was 57%. In addition, 27 other providers, including 10 family-friends-neighbors and 17 relative-care-exempt providers answered a separate survey asking for "expected", rather than "actual" rates (see Appendix F for more details). Based on a sample size of 143, the response rate for this additional survey was 19%.

#### Methods

This section describes the sample, population of interest, survey, data collection method and analysis used for this study. The data collection was provided by the Human Ecology Learning and Problem Solving (HELPS) Lab, located in the Department of Political Science at Montana State University. An email was sent to all child care providers listed in the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) database, which included a link to a Qualtrics questionnaire. Those providers not responding to the email request were mailed a paper copy of the questionnaire. Seventy-nine percent answered the Qualtrics (on-line) original survey, while 21% of respondents answered the original paper survey. The post card survey was only a Qualtrics (on-line survey).

#### Data

The population of interest in this study is child care providers and the children in their child care facilities. The unit of observation in the licensed child care centers is the provider, who reported on the prices charged to groups of children. The units of observation in the registered and licensed child care homes are the provider for standard market rates and the child for actual market rates paid. When considering actual market rates paid, the rate paid by the parents of each child in the family or group child care facility was reported. While a substantial amount of information was collected on all providers and those children in their care, the study is focused on those children who received no discounts or scholarships. In addition, no Head Start facilities were included in the summary financial statistics.

Each of the two survey instruments (home and center surveys) was comprised of 50 questions. Copies of the two surveys are included in Appendices G (homes questionnaire) and H (centers questionnaire). Institutional Review Board approval of an exemption was received on March 27, 2023, and the survey announcement with a link to the online survey was emailed to providers from the Early Childhood Services Bureau on March 29. Postcards with the online survey link were mailed to providers on April 5 and the cover letter with the questionnaire was mailed to all providers who had not yet completed the online survey on April 27 and May 1. All providers who had not responded by the second round of mailings were contacted by the MSU survey team by telephone starting the second week of June. A second questionnaire was sent to all respondents upon request, and 11 additional questionnaires were sent to providers between July 13 and July 20. The online survey was closed on July 24, 2023.

The Post Card survey was initiated because important child care subsidy programs had been terminated since the original survey data was collected in March through May 2023. Based on conversations with providers, it was expected that child care rates had increased substantially since May 2023. The post card survey link was sent to respondents on September 30. Copies of the two post card surveys are included in Appendix I (Post Card). The post card survey was closed on October 18, 2023.

#### Analysis

The two market rate surveys (homes and centers) covered many of the same topics. However, the home-based survey requested detailed information on each child, such as age, hours per week in care, and rate charged; while the center-based survey requested rates by age group and length of care (full- or part-time). This study generated hourly, daily, weekly and monthly rates for full- and part-time coverage. These rates were generated for infants (less than 1 year old), toddlers (1 to 2 years old), pre-school (3 to 5), and school age (older than 6 years of age) for each of the seven child care regions in Montana. Imputations were substituted for missing values to convert monthly and weekly rates into daily and hourly rates. Monthly rates were divided by 22 days to convert them to daily rates and weekly rates were divided by 5 days to convert them to daily rates were converted to hourly rates by dividing them by 7.5 hours/day.

The two post card surveys focused on standard licensed (family, group, and center) and legally registered (family, friends, and neighbors and relative care exempt) providers. The standard license providers were asked to "enter your rates", while the legally registered providers were asked to "enter the rates you would charge if you were to set your own rates." Please see Appendix I (Post Card) for the Qualtrics surveys.

#### **Statistics**

The most important statistic for this study is the rate at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile for each of the age groups. Four age groups, infants, toddlers, preschool and school-aged reported in the body of the report. While the study reports the rate at the 75th percentile, it was important to report some measure of the variance. In this instance, confidence intervals are reported for the mean, 50<sup>th</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup>, and 75<sup>th</sup> percentiles. Given that child care rates are not normally distributed, a distribution-free 95% confidence interval is reported. These confidence intervals will have different margins of error on the lower bound than the upper bound. Confidence intervals describe the reliability of the survey results. For instance, statewide center, infant full-time daily rate mean is \$50.03, but the 95% confidence interval varies between \$47.61 and \$52.45.

The number of observations is reported for all results. Observations reported in the financial section of the report do not include child care facilities associated with Head Start or children receiving Best Beginning Scholarships because of the guidelines established for computing the market rates. In addition, respondents only partially completing the survey are not included in the results of the financial section. However, in the non-financial section of the report all observations are included. A Statistical Analysis System (SAS) statistical routine was employed to generate the percentiles and confidence intervals. Using this statistical routine, all means and percentile estimates and confidence intervals were unweighted in provider level analyses. Four methods were used to collect the market rate information and they are as follows:

Method 1, the survey collected full and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged) and these full and part-time "advertised rates" were supplemented by information from the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) "advertised daily rates" for full and half-days, and hourly and daily rates were imputed from monthly and weekly data supplied by these providers. Again, the unit of observation for this method is the provider. Results from this method are reported in the body of the report with additional details reported in Appendices A (Full-Time) and B (Part-Time).

Method 2, the survey collected full and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged). The unit of observation for this method is the provider. This method reports only the result from the original survey without any supplemental information, such as the CCUBS data, or imputations. Results from this method are reported in Appendix C.

Method 3, the survey collected child level market rate information, which was reported by family and group providers for each child in their facility. The unit of observation for this method is the child. Results from this method are reported in the Appendix D.

Post Card (Method 4), the two surveys collected provider level market rate information for October, 2023, which was reported for standard licensed and legally registered providers. The unit of observation is the provider. Post Card results for standard providers and legally registered providers are reported in Appendix E and F, respectively.

#### Results

Child care prices were measured in three ways in the homes survey and two ways in the center survey. In the homes survey method, respondents were asked to provide hourly, daily, weekly and monthly rates for infants, toddlers, preschool, school-aged children; method 2 asked respondents to provide weekday (Monday-Friday) and weekend (Saturday-Sunday) rates for four age groups (infants, toddlers, preschool, school-aged children) with no scholarships or discounts; and method 3 asked respondents to provide full and part-time weekday and weekend rates for each child in their care. Using the methods described above, these hourly, daily, weekly, and monthly rates are reported in Appendices A , B, and C for home-and center-based providers for infants, toddlers, preschool, and school-aged children. The market rates reported for Appendices A, B, and C were advertised rates supplied by the providers. The market rates reported for Appendix D were supplied in monthly units only. The monthly payments were adjusted to compensate for children utilizing the day care facility for different number of hours each week. In this study, the average number of hours per week (37.5 hours) was divided by the total number of hours used by the child to generate an "adjusted monthly" rate.

Table 2 summarizes daily and monthly market rates for infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged children in family and group child care facilities and centers. Full- and part-time market rates are estimated using Method 1, where survey generated rates include imputations and are supplemented by CCUBS rates. Daily and monthly means and percentiles (50, 60, and 75) are reported in the table.

#### *Child care facilities*

#### Full-time Rates for Family Child care facilities

Appendices A, B, and C report the mean, 50th, 60th, and 75th percentile information for infants, toddlers, preschool, school-aged children in family or group child care settings. Appendix A reported "advertised daily and hourly rates" reported in the survey, survey imputations, and supplemented by "advertised rates" reported in CCUBS. Appendix B reported "advertised monthly, weekly, daily, and hourly rates" reported in the survey only. Appendix C reports monthly, weekly, daily, and hourly rates paid by parents and guardians to the provider. These rates are reported by the provider. Child care market reported in Tables 2 through 14 are based Method 1 with additional detail available in Appendix A. For more information on means, percentiles and confidence intervals in Method 2 and 3, see the tables in Appendices B and C. Tables 3 through 14 report the 75th percentile rate only.

#### Infant, Family Rates

Using Method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for infants in family child care homes were in Region 4 (Table 3). The lowest daily rates were in Regions 3 and 5, while the lowest monthly rate was in Region 3. The Montana daily rate (\$40) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily infant rate for Montana increased from \$35 to \$40 per day (or 14%), while the monthly infant rate increased from \$775 to \$836 (or 8%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (34% increase), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was also in Region 4 (24%). All regions realized increasing or stable monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except regions 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

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#### Toddler, Family Rates

Using Method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for toddlers in family child care homes were in Region 4 (Table 4). The lowest daily rates were in Regions 3 and 5, while the lowest monthly rates were in regions 3, 5 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$40) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily toddler rate for Montana increased from \$35 to \$40 per day (14%), while the monthly toddler rate increased from \$770 to \$814 (6%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 7 (21%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 2 (20%). All regions remained the same or realized an increase in monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except regions 1, 3,5, and 6.

Preschool, Family Rates

Method 1 results show that the highest daily rates for preschool-aged children in family child care homes were in Regions 1, 2, and 4, while the highest monthly rate was in Region 4 (Table 5). The lowest daily rates were in Regions 3 and 5, while the lowest monthly rate was in Regions 3 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$36.00) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily preschool rate for Montana increased from \$35 to \$36.00 per day (3%), while the monthly preschool rate increased from \$700 to \$836 (19%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (25%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was also in Region 4 (42%). All regions realized a increase in monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except Regions 5 and 6.

School, Family Rates

Method 1 results show that the highest daily and monthly rates for school-aged children in family child care homes were in Region 4 (Table 6). The lowest daily rate was in Region 5, while the lowest monthly rate was in Region 1. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$35) is substantially higher than the current state rate (\$30) for all regions.

The daily school-aged rate for Montana increased from \$33 to \$35 per day (6%), while the monthly school-aged rate declined slightly from \$700 to \$836 (19%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (41%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was also in Region 4 (57%). All regions realized increasing or stable in monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except Regions 1 and 5.

#### Infant, Group Rates

Using method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for infants in group child care homes were in Region 1(Table 7). The lowest daily and monthly rates were in Regions 3, 5 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$45) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily infant rate for Montana increased from \$35 to \$45 per day (29%), while the monthly infant rate increased from \$730 to \$900 (23%). The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Regions 1 and 2 (over 57%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 1 (45%). All regions realized stable or increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023.

Toddler, Group Rates

Using the method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for toddlers in group child care homes were in Regions 1 and 2 (Table 8). The lowest daily and monthly rates were in Regions 3 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$45) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily toddler rate for Montana increased from \$35 to \$45 per day (29%), while the monthly toddler rate increased from \$730 to \$886 (21%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 1 (64%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 2 (48%). All regions realized increasing or stable monthly rates from 2020 to 2023.

Preschool, Group Rates

Method 1 results show that the highest daily rate for preschool-aged children in group child care homes was in Regions 1 and 2, while the highest monthly rates were in Regions 1 and 4 (Table 9). The lowest daily rates were in Region 3 and 6, while the lowest monthly rates were in Regions 3, 5 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$43) is greater than the current state rate (\$35) for all regions.

The daily preschool rate for Montana increased from \$33 to \$43 per day (29%), while the monthly preschool rate increased from \$700 to \$880 (26%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 2 (52% increase), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 4 (60%). All regions realized stable or increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023.

Method 1 results show that the highest daily rate for school-aged children in group child care homes was in Region 2, while the highest monthly rate was in Regions 1 and 2 (Table 10). The lowest daily rate was in Regions 3, 6, and 7, while the lowest monthly rate was in Region 3. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$40) is substantially higher than the current state rate (\$33) for all regions.

The daily school-aged rate for Montana increased from \$33 to \$40 per day (21%), while the monthly school-aged rate increased from \$700 to \$820 (17%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 2 (73% increase), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 2 (54%). All regions realized increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023.

#### Infant, Center Rates

Using method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for infants in child care centers were in Region 4 (Table 11). The lowest daily and monthly rates were in Region 3. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$55.00) is greater than the current state rate (\$45) for all regions.

The daily infant rate for Montana increased from \$45 to \$55 per day (22%), while the monthly infant rate increased from \$975 to \$1,188 (22%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (56%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 1 (45%). All regions realized increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except Region 6.

#### Toddler, Center Rates

Using method 1, the highest daily and monthly rates for toddlers in child care centers were in Region 4 (Table 12). The lowest daily and hourly rates were in Region 3. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$54) is greater than the current state rate (\$45) for all regions.

The daily toddler rate for Montana increased from \$45 to \$54 per day (20%), while the monthly toddler rate increased from \$915 to \$1,150 (26%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (52%), while the largest percentage daily rate increase was in Region 3 (42%). All regions realized increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023.

#### Preschool, Center Rates

Method 1 results show that the highest daily and monthly rates were in Region 4 for preschool-aged children in child care centers (Table 13). The lowest daily and monthly rates were in Regions 3 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$50) is greater than the current state rate (\$40) for all regions.

The daily preschool rate for Montana increased from \$40 to \$50.00 per day (25%), while the monthly preschool rate increased from \$865 to \$1,056 (22%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (40%), while the largest percentage month rate increase was in Region 3 (38%). All regions realized increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except Region 6.

#### School, Center Rates

Method 1 results show that the highest daily and monthly rates for school-aged children in child care centers were in Region 4 (Table 14). The lowest daily and monthly rates were in Regions 3 and 6. The Montana daily rate calculated using method 1 (\$48) is greater than the current state rate (\$40) for all regions.

The daily school-aged rate for Montana increased from \$38 to \$48 per day (25%), while the monthly school-aged rate increased from \$860 to \$975 (13%) from 2020 to 2023. The largest percentage daily rate increase from 2020 to 2023 was in Region 4 (44%), while the largest percentage monthly rate increase was in Region 3 (63%). All regions realized increasing monthly rates from 2020 to 2023, except Regions 1 and 6.

#### Other Costs and Benefits Accrued by Providers

The full cost of attendance at child care facilities must include additional costs, such as registration fees, recurring enrollment fees, and other fees; and, additional benefits, such as transportation, discounts, and scholarships. Only 27% of home-based providers charged one-time registration fees, while 50% of center-based providers charged these fees (Table 15). Only 16% of home-based providers charged recurring enrollment fees, while 37% of center-based provider charged these fees. Additional activity fees were charged by 18% and 38% of homes and centers, respectively. Less than 15% of home- and center-based providers charged parents a fee to put their name on the waitlist.

On the additional benefits side of the equation for families, less than 17% of homes and centers provided transportation (Table 15). Centers were much more likely to offer multi-child (46% of centers and 31% of homes) and employee (72% of centers and 35% of homes) discounts. Family and friend discounts were offered by less than 16% of homes and centers; and other types of discounts were offered 27% of homes and 37% of centers. Best Beginnings Scholarships (BBS) children were in 90% of the centers and 87% of the homes.

Other important benefits for parents and providers are the provision of food, services provided at reduced costs, and reimbursements or donations from other organizations (Table 16). Sixty-three percent of homes and 61% of centers receive CACFP reimbursement. Center-based providers take advantage of free or reduced costs for building use (19%), utilities (11%), volunteer work (24%), furniture and equipment (9%), and supplies (8%), while home-based providers have very few of these opportunities (less than 7%).

Providers can also receive reimbursements or donations from other organizations. Fifty percent of centers and 24% of homes participate in STARS. Other reimbursements or donations were paid by government entities, private donations, foundations and other organizations.


Characteristics of the Home-and Center-Based Samples

Waiting lists are an important consideration when examining the price of child care because it's an indicator of the demand for services. One would expect that providers with waiting lists for various age groups would charge higher prices than those without waiting lists. Waiting lists in this study must be used with caution because these numbers don't distinguish between children not receiving child care services from those children receiving child care services who want to move to another provider.

Fifty percent of home-based providers and 65% of center-based providers have waiting lists for full-time children (Table 18). Thirty-six percent home-based providers and 41% of center providers had waiting lists for full-time infants. Thirty-three percent home-based providers and 44% of center providers had waiting lists for full-time toddlers. Twenty-eight percent home-based providers and 49% of center providers had waiting lists for full-time preschool children. And, six percent home-based providers and 11% of center providers had waiting lists for full-time school-aged children.

The waiting list for part-time care in homes was substantially lower, where only 18% of homes and 29% of centers have waiting lists for part-time care. Similar patterns exist for all of the age groups, although the percentage of providers with a waiting list for part-time care decreases substantially over the age of 5.

Over 65% of the home-based providers care for 9 or more children, while over 83% of centers care for more than 25 children (Table 19). Less than 20% of both center- and home-based providers offer drop-in care. And finally, 64% of home-based providers and 46% of center-based providers offer after-school care during the school year. Over 40% of homes and centers offer full- or part-day care for school-aged children during the summer.

When evaluating child care capacity, it is important to include the number of available slots, which are slots not currently being occupied by enrolled children. Providers were asked if they had slots available by age group during the month of March. Thirty percent of the home-based providers and 48% of center-based providers had slots available. Less than 20% of home-and center-based providers had slots available for infants or toddlers (Table 20). The highest percentage of available slots was for preschool-aged children with 37% of centers and 21% of homes having available slots. Less than 10% of home- and center-based providers had slots for school-aged children.

Access to child care includes access for all children in need of care, and it is important to ensure that marginalized groups have such access. The percentage of center-based providers who have children with special needs, are homeless, are of low-income, are migrants, speak a language other than English, are cared for by kin, and are in foster care is considerably higher than the percentage of homes-based providers who have children with these characteristics (Table 21). Sixty percent of homes and 86% of centers have children with special needs, and 67% of homes and 84% of centers have children from low-income families.

Providers were asked a hypothetical question about potential changes to the number of children in their program, specifically, if they would increase or decrease the number of children in their program within each age category. Table 22 below illustrates the number and percentage of home- and center-based providers who would increase and decrease the number of children in each age group. Both homes- and center-based providers reported being more likely to increase toddler (at least 21% of providers) and preschool (at least 25% of providers) enrollment rather than increase infant enrollment (less than 17% of providers). A slightly higher percentage of center-based providers and 9% of homes), reported potentially increasing school-age enrollment. Very few providers reported potentially decreasing enrollment.

#### **Operating Schedules**

The average number of hours open during the weekdays (Monday through Friday) is slightly over 10 hours and nearly all homes and centers are open full-time (Table 23). Less than 7% of homes are open on the weekends, but these few homes are open more hours on weekends (over 11 hours). Only 2% of centers are open on the weekends, and they are open for more hours on weekends (over 13 hours).

A majority of the home- and center-based providers closed for more than 6 days each year for national, state, and religious holidays (Table 24). Home-based providers were more likely to charge for these holidays than center-based providers (57% of homes and 50% of centers). In addition, over 40% of home-based and 57% of center-based providers closed for more than 6 days each year for personal vacations, summer, or other reasons. Home-based

providers were less likely to charge for these closed days than center-based providers (40% of homes and 50% of centers). About three-fourths of both homes-based and center-based providers charge for absent days.

#### **Business Policies**

Nearly three-quarters of all homes- and centers-based providers offer both full-time and part-time care, and fewer than 6% of providers offer only part-time care (Table 25).

Defining what constitutes full-time care is important in this study because of the wide range of hours of care across all providers. This study examined three minimums establishing full-time: (1) hours per day; (2) hours per week; and, (3) days per week (Table 26). For those respondents answering the question, the highest percentage of home provider respondents suggests the full-time care is 5 to 6 hours per day, while the highest percentage of center provider respondents suggest that full-time care is 6 to 7 or more hours per day. When considering hours per week, the highest percentage of provider respondents for both homes and centers suggest that full-time care is 26 hours or more per week. And finally, when considering days per week, the highest percentage of both homes and center respondents suggest that full-time care is 1 to 4 days. Although, over 44% of home- and center-based providers reported that full-time care is defined as 5 days or more of care.

Homes and centers are distinguished by other characteristics, such as the legal organization of their business (profit or non-profit), affiliations, reimbursements, services provided to them at a reduced cost, participation in Montana STARS to Quality, and accreditations or certifications (Table 27).

Nearly all home-based providers are for-profit businesses, while only 46% of centerbased are for-profit businesses (and 49% are non-profit organizations). Very few center-based providers were affiliated with another organization, while no home-based providers were affiliated with another organization. Less than 6% of home-based child care facilities were associated with churches, community-based organization, Head Start, or other organizations. Less than 20% of centers were associated with churches or religious organizations, community organizations, or private or parochial schools. While 5% of home-based providers were associated with other organizations, 48% of center-based providers had some other associations with other organizations.

Only 24% of the home-based providers were in the STARS to Quality program. About 50% of the center-base providers were in STARS to Quality with a majority of them in level 2 or higher. Over 42% of center-based providers and 50% of home-based providers have achieved a STAR 2 on the Montana STARS to Quality program, which affords them financial incentives.

Less than 4% of home-based providers and more than 7% of center-based providers had any accreditations or certifications. The most widely held certification was with the National Association for the Education of Young Children/For Family Child Care (NAEYC/NAFC).

There is variety in the types of fees providers charge, how often fees are charged, when parents pay for care, and the unit of time used in charging for care. Of the providers who charge enrollment fees, the most common frequency for paying fees is once per calendar year, which was reported by 46% of home and center providers (Table 28).

Very few providers charge an activity/supply fee. Of the providers that charge an additional activity or supply fee, the most common frequency for paying fees is once per calendar year. Center-based providers are more likely to charge such a fee.

The most common frequency of tuition rates is monthly, with 52% of homes-based providers and 76% of centers-based providers charging rates on a monthly basis. Just over a third of homes-based providers charge daily rates, and less than a quarter of centers-based providers charge daily rates. The majority of providers, 59% of homes-based providers and 71% of centers-based providers, charge for care before care is provided (Table 27).

#### **Business Challenges**

In order to ensure that all children have access to quality child care, the state-funded Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarship provides financial assistance to qualifying families for care in licensed and registered child care programs. Providers are able to choose whether to accept children who receive the scholarship and set their own policies around enrollment of such families. Over 94% of both homes- and center-based providers will accept children receiving the Best Beginnings Scholarship, and few providers allocate or limit slots for children receiving the scholarship (Table 29). About one-half of the providers charge the difference between the state rates and their standard rates, and it's hard to be certain whether they choose not to charge the difference or if there is no difference between the two rates.

Providers were asked to identify challenges they experience with the Best Beginnings scholarship program. The most common challenges reported by both homes-and centers-based providers were: reimbursement rates are too low, reported by 53% of homes and 55% of centers; limits on hours that are reimbursed, reported by 45% of homes and 46% of centers; and reimbursements are paid after the services are provided, reported by 44% of homes and centers.

Providers were asked to identify barriers that they think make opening a licensed child care program difficult. The most commonly reported barrier was challenges hiring qualified staff, which was selected by over 79% of homes-based providers and by 97% of centers-based providers (Table 30). High start-up costs and challenges meeting training and licensing requirements were also commonly selected barriers.

Providers were also asked to select from a list of possible reasons a provider might choose to close their program. A majority of homes- and centers-based providers selected feelings of burnout, long work hours, low pay, and challenges keeping qualified staff.

Providers were asked to report the maximum staffing ratio they would feel safe implementing in their program (Table 31). Nearly two-thirds of home provider respondents answering the question suggested an infant staffing ratio of 1 to 3 children per provider, while 85% of center provider respondents suggested an infant staffing ratio of 4 to 6 children per provider. Over 60% of home providers suggest a staffing ratio of 6 or less for toddlers, less than 10 for preschool-aged, and less than 13 for school-age children. Over 55% of center providers suggested a staffing ratio of 6 or less for toddlers, and less than 13 for preschool- and school-aged children.

#### **Conclusions and Limitations**

The child care study utilized a revised version of home- and center-based questionnaires developed and validated by the Child and Family Research Institute at the University of Texas to describe market rates charged by child care providers in Montana. The data collection was completed by the HELPS Lab at Montana State University and the analysis was completed by George Haynes, Ph.D. and Lisa Curry, M.S. in the Department of Agricultural Economics and JG Research, respectively. Seventy-five percent of center-based (190 observations) and 53% of home-based (344 observations) providers completed the questionnaires for an overall response rate of 59%.

The market rate study for 2023 utilized four primary methods to assess changes in child care rates from the previous study in 2020 in the seven regions of Montana. The first method utilized survey collected full- and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged) and these "advertised rates" were supplemented by information from the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) "advertised daily rates" for full and half-days, and hourly and daily rates imputed from monthly and weekly data supplied by these providers in the survey. This supplemented database enabled a more complete assessment of the seven regions in Montana and is the primary method employed to recommend statewide and regional rates. The unit of observation for this method was the provider.

The second method collected full and part-time "advertised rate" information for four age groups (infant, toddler, preschool, and school-aged). This method reports only the result from the original survey without any supplemental information, such as the CCUBS data, or imputations. The unit of observation for this method is the provider.

The third method collected child level market rate information, which was reported by family and group providers for each child in their facility. The unit of observation for this method was the child.

In addition, a fourth method was employed to assess the changes in child care rates between March 2023, when the original survey data was collected, and October 2023, when ARPA Child Care Stabilization (ACCS) grants were no longer paid to child care providers. With the ACCS unavailable, it was anticipated that child care rates paid by parents would increase. This survey only asked respondents to report their current rates for infants (0-1), toddlers (1-3), preschool (3-5) and school-aged (6+). Using a list of all child care providers in Montana, the respondents were classified by the type of facility (family home, family group, or center). This survey had 468 respondents with the unit of observation being the provider.

#### Advertised Rates

Monthly and Daily rates were reported by substantially more child care providers than weekly or hourly rates; although these conclusions will discuss hourly, daily, weekly, and monthly estimates. When comparing child care rates using Methods 1 and 2, there are no statistically significant differences between child care rates in the two databases. When comparing child care rates between Methods 1 and 3 only three child care rates (family toddler; group toddler, and family preschool) were significantly different. This assessment suggests that Method 1 results are very similar to Methods 2 and 3 results.

Method 4 data was collected to determine if child care market rates increased between March and October 2023. Mean infant rates increased by 8.8%; mean toddler rates increased by 7.6%; mean preschool rates increased by 5.9%; and mean school rates increased by 6.2%. Even though child care rates appeared to increase, there were only significant differences for infant family and infant group rates. This assessment suggests that only selected child care rates for infants increased between March and October 2023.

Even though child care rates are reported by the DPHHS, providers set their rates based on their local condition; hence, there is substantial variance in the rates. For instance, monthly rates vary between less than \$500 to over \$2,000 per month and daily rates vary between less than \$20 to over \$100 per day. Charts 1 and 2 are scatterplots of the monthly and daily rate information using Method 1.

**Chart 1: Monthly Rates** 





Chart 2: Daily Rates



#### Child Care Rates, 2020 and 2023 Differences

Previous analyses of child care rates in Montana have suggested that statewide rates based on the 75th percentile estimates were appropriate because no statistically significant differences existed between geographic regions; however, in this study, Regions 1, 2, and 4 rates were significantly higher than other regions for group and center providers. Table 32 reports the statewide daily and monthly rates for Method 1 using 75th percentile rates in 2020 and 2023 (March).

Assessing child care rate changes from 2020 to 2023 requires examining two comparisons: (1) 2020 state rates and 2023 March rates (Table 32) and (2) 2020 state rates and 2023 October rates (Table 33).

Table 32 compares the 2020 state rates with 2023 (March) rates recommended in this study. The most substantial increases will be for group home providers, who would see their daily rates increase by 21% to 29%, and monthly rates increase by 17% to 26%. Family and center providers would realize somewhat smaller, but substantial increases. Daily rates for center providers will increase by 19% to 25% and monthly rates will increase by 13% to 26%. Daily rates for family providers will increase by 0% to 14% and monthly rates will increase by 6% to 19%.

The number of respondents was similar for the March (534) and October (468) samples. While the March database provided extensive information about provider's business and children in their care and the database was supplemented by information from the Child Care Under the Big Sky (CCUBS) "advertised daily rates" and daily rates were imputed from monthly and weekly data supplied by providers. The October respondents were only asked to report their advertised child care rates and this database was not supplemented by CCUBS rates or any imputations. When comparing the March and October 2023 child care rate estimates, the October 2023 rates were higher, but not statistically different, than the March estimates. An alternative to the March 2023 state rates proposed in Table A would be to use the more current, October 2023, results for setting state rates.


If statewide 75<sup>th</sup> percentile rates for October 2023 are used to set Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarship reimbursements based on 75<sup>th</sup> percentile rates, all rates will increase from their 2020 level (Table 33). The most substantial increases will be for group home providers, who would see their daily rates increase by 36% to 38%, and monthly rates increase by 26% to 37%. Center and family providers would realize somewhat smaller, but substantial increases. Daily rates for center providers will increase by 25% to 38% and monthly rates will increase by 28% to 43%. Daily rates for family providers will increase by 14% to 29% and monthly rates will increase by 16% to 29%.

#### Regional Child Care Rate Differences

The regression analysis supports having somewhat higher child care rates for high growth counties, which included Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, and Yellowstone. These high growth counties had population increases of 2,000 people or more from 2000 to 2022 (see Map 2).



#### Map 2: High Growth Counties in CCR&R Regions in Montana

The state rates should be the minimal rates available to all providers; however, some premium (additional funding) could be considered for selected high growth counties. Given that the percentage difference between the state rate estimates and high growth county estimates ranges between 5 to 34%; a premium of 15% could be offered to providers located in high growth counties. The rates are reported in Table 34, which compares the proposed state rates using March 2023 rates and proposed rates with a 15% premium paid to providers in the high growth counties. If the October 2023 rates were used to set the state rates, then the proposed rates with a 15% premium would be increased to the rates reported in Table 35.

Other statistical analyses were performed to assess differences in rural and urban communities, high- and low-income counties, and quality of care (measured by participation in STARS to Quality). The urban communities were Billings, Bozeman, Helena, Kalispell, Missoula, Great Falls, and Butte. The high growth counties were Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, and Yellowstone. The high growth counties were Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, and Yellowstone. The high-growth counties had increased their population by at least 2,000 people between 2020 and 2022 (U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division). The high-income counties were Jefferson, Gallatin, Stillwater, Valley, Yellowstone, Richland, Lewis and Clark, and Madison. These counties had average annual median household income above \$70,000 in 2022 (Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates, 2022).

Using regression analyses, providers in urban communities had similar monthly and daily rates for children in rural communities. Higher income counties had higher daily and monthly child care rates for center providers for infants, toddler, and preschool aged children. And finally, group STARS providers had significantly higher daily child care rates than non-STARS providers for infant, toddlers, and preschool children. These differences in market rates across urban and rural counties, and high- and low-growth and income communities, and STARS providers warrant further review.

#### **Billing** Policies

The majority of providers (59% of homes and 71% of centers) charge families for services before care is provided, and a majority of providers (87% of homes and 90% of centers) accept children who receive the Best Beginnings scholarship. These findings are important when considering any potential changes to state reimbursement policies, since the predominant billing practice reported by providers differs from current state policy. In addition, 44% of home-based and center-based providers reported that reimbursements being paid after care is provided is a challenge with accepting Best Beginnings recipients, as are low state reimbursement rates (53% of homes and 55% of centers) and limitations on hours covered (45% of homes and 46% of centers).

#### Challenges

When asked what challenges might make it hard for new programs to open, providers reported: challenges hiring staff (79% of homes and 97% of centers), meeting training requirements (44% of homes and 45% of centers), and high startup costs (53% of homes and 66% of centers). When asked what challenges might lead to providers closing their programs, over three-fourths (75%) of providers reported: feelings of burnout, long work hours, low pay, and challenges keeping qualified staff. Further analysis is needed to more completely explore these challenges to understand what is limiting the supply of child care workers in Montana.

In addition, this study offered providers an opportunity to share what they believe are challenges with the Best Beginning scholarship program and with opening and operating a child care business. The majority of providers accept children receiving the Best Beginnings child care scholarship, and fewer than 10% allocate or limit slots for scholarship recipients.

#### Limitations

This study utilized four different methods to report child care market rate information. The original market rate survey provided the basis for three methods with an additional survey initiated in October which provided updated child care rate information. The original market rate survey was supplemented by CCUBS rate information and imputations based on provider data. For instance, if the provider reported monthly but not daily child care rates, the monthly rate was divided by 22 days to replace the missing daily rate. Imputation strategies often are not useful; however, this methodology enabled additional data to be available for reporting child care rates at the regional level.

Child care rate information for individual children was based on monthly data only. Monthly data needed to be revised to address the number of hours each week that the child used the facility. In addition, a similar imputation strategy was employed to convert monthly data into hourly, daily, and weekly estimates. When monthly data is used, it would be important for the provider to indicate whether the monthly payment varied by the number of hours in the facility.

Market rate information supplied by the providers is "advertised rates," which has been used in previous Montana studies. While collecting market rate information from parents and guardians would be expensive, it would allow reporting of "actual rates," based on payments by the parents and guardians, rather than "advertised rates," which may or may not be what parents actually pay.

And finally, 59% of the child care providers completed the March questionnaire and 57% completed the October (post card) questionnaire, which is up from the 55% response rate achieved in the 2020 study. When comparing the response rates between 2020 and 2023, it is important to consider the challenges being experienced by child care providers as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
