Injuries, Deaths and Child Abuse in Child Care Settings

Creating safe environments, providing for appropriate ratios, and the actively supervising children are proven methods in preventing injuries. Montana's Child Care Licensing program has established rules to support caregivers in providing these foundational health and safety measures. Child care providers are required to give parents a written report delineating incidents, accidents, or injuries involving their child and to report to Child Care Licensing any fatality and any accident that required medical attention. In the same way, parents should maintain an open communication with caregivers and take the initiative to protect their children. Child Care Licensing, child care providers, and parents work together to protect children from undue harm.
