

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# Update on WASP Amendment Removing 12-Month Continuous Coverage for PCR Population

Montana submitted an amendment to remove 12-month continuous coverage for the Parent and Other Caretaker Relative population from the WASP Waiver.

Waiver Implementation and

- The 1115 Waiver for Additional Services and Populations (WASP) currently provides a 12-month continuous eligibility period for Parents and Other Caretaker Relatives (PCR) whose eligibility is based on section 1931 or 1925 of the Social Security Act and have income 0–24% FPL.
- A WASP amendment was approved March 30, 2022, that removes the expenditure authority for 12-month continuous eligibility for the PCR population.
- The implementation of that change will not be effective until the end of the federal public health emergency.

# Summary of Montana's Current WASP Demonstration

- Montana's WASP Demonstration, formally known as the Basic Medicaid Waiver, has remained a positive source of Medicaid coverage since the program's inception in 1996.
- The WASP offers Standard Medicaid benefits to:
  - Individuals aged 18 or older with SDMI who are otherwise ineligible for Medicaid benefits and either:
    - Have income 0-138% of the FPL and are eligible for or enrolled in Medicare; or
    - Have income 139-150% of the FPL.
  - o This population under WASP is limited to 3,000 members at one time.

- The Aged, Blind or Disabled (ABD) population are individuals determined categorically eligible for Medicaid based on their age, blindness and/or disability.
  - This population receives a single limited benefit under WASP in addition to their Standard Medicaid benefit. That benefit is dental treatment services above the \$1,125 State Plan dental treatment cap.
  - There is no membership limit for this population.

## Background On Section 1115 Waiver Authority

- Under Section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services has authority to approve a state's request to waive compliance with provisions of federal Medicaid law
- An 1115 Waiver must be:
  - An experimental, pilot or demonstration project;
  - ✓ Likely to assist in promoting the objectives of the Medicaid program;
  - Budget neutral to the federal government; and
  - ✓ Limited in duration to the extent and period necessary to carry out the demonstration
- States must provide a public process for notice and comment on proposed demonstration applications and extensions

## **WASP Eligible Populations**

This extension request does not propose any changes to the current populations served under the WASP Waiver.

#### **WASP Waiver**

- The extension request will not affect the current populations served by the WASP Program, including:
  - o Individuals aged 18 or older with SDMI who are otherwise ineligible for Medicaid benefits and either:
    - Have income 0–138% of the FPL and are eligible for or enrolled in Medicare;
       or
    - Have income 139–150% of the FPL.
  - The Aged, Blind or Disabled (ABD) population are individuals determined categorically eligible for Medicaid based on their age, blindness and/or disability.
    - This population receives a single limited benefit under WASP in addition to their Standard Medicaid benefit. That benefit is dental treatment services above the \$1,125 State Plan dental treatment cap.

## Delivery System, Benefits, and Cost Sharing

**Proposed Waiver Extension Request** 

This extension request does not propose any changes to the Medicaid health care delivery system, benefits, nor cost sharing for WASP enrollees.

#### **WASP Waiver**

- The State does not propose any changes to the Medicaid health care delivery system.
- Demonstration enrollees will continue to receive services through the State's fee-forservice delivery system.
- Demonstration enrollees will continue to receive the same benefits as they currently receive through the standard Medicaid benefit
- The State does not propose any changes to benefits for Demonstration enrollees.
- Montana currently does not apply cost sharing to any of its Medicaid members and therefore no cost sharing will be imposed under this 1115 extension request
