Montana Asthma Home Visiting Program (MAP)




Committed to improving asthma one visit at a time.

MAP empowers individuals with uncontrolled asthma and their families to gain the knowledge and tools needed to manage the disease. Since implementation in 2011, MAP has served a total of 929 Montanans with uncontrolled asthma in 35 counties. The MAP is a free service with no insurance requirements.

The program includes six visits with a trained home visiting nurse or respiratory therapist who provides specific education and support to help clients self-manage their asthma. Educational topics include:

- · environmental asthma triggers,
- · asthma medications and inhaler technique,
- · asthma action plans,
- and the importance of regular medical care.

MAP provides **in-home** visits across 21 counties, with virtual home visiting available in all 56 counties.

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MAP has been serving Montana families for **14 years**.




817 children (0 to 17 years of age) served since 2011 and **108 adults** served since 2020.
