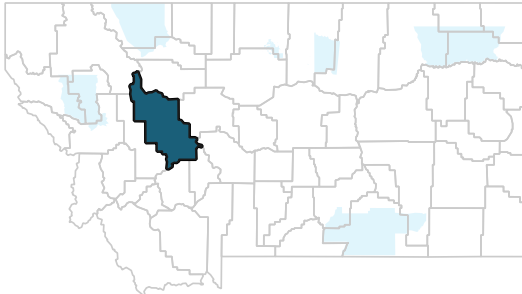


Montana's Current Medicaid Program Helps Keep Lewis & Clark County Healthy

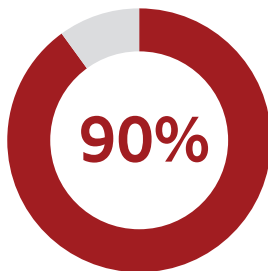

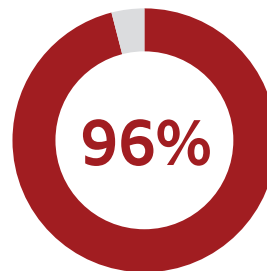

Continue Montana's Current Medicaid Program

In 2015, Montana raised Medicaid eligibility for adults to 138 percent of the federal poverty line. The Legislature must vote to continue Montana's current Medicaid program in 2025, or thousands of Montanans risk losing their health insurance.

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
