

Montana Disability and Health Data Resource Guide

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Purpose

The purpose of the Montana Disability & Health (MTDH) Data Resource Guide is to provide public health professionals in Montana with a resource to strengthen disability representation in their perspective data and media efforts.

Resource Audience

The MTDH Data Resource Guide provides insights to help inform the healthcare needs of Montanans with disabilities. The goal is to build data capacity among valuable partners to help turn data into action.



Data Policy

Improving Disability Representation in Data

Expanding and improving the collection, reporting and analysis of standardized disability data across health systems is vital to understand and improve the current health status and outcomes of people with disabilities. Data itself is critical for public health planning and equitable allocation of resources.

- Data should be able to be disaggregated by disability, just like age, gender, ethnicity, etc.
- Diverse data sources are important to look at intersectional disparities for people with disabilities.
- Funding mechanisms for disability data collection for deeper understanding of needs around disability data and how to best measure disability disparities based on input from community experts and people with lived experiences.

Data Collection Standards

American Community Survey (ACS) has six Yes or No questions that assess functioning, called ACS-6. A "yes" response to any of these questions indicates a disability for the purposes of the ACS. The ACS-6 is used to assess disability as a core demographic.

1. Are you deaf, or do you have serious difficulty hearing?
2. Are you blind, or do you have serious difficulty seeing, even when wearing glasses?
3. Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition, do you have serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions? (5 years old or older)
4. Do you have serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs? (5 years old or older)
5. Do you have difficulty dressing or bathing? (5 years old or older)
6. Because of a physical, mental or emotional condition, do you have difficulty doing errands alone such as visiting a doctor's office or shopping? (15 years old or older)

- The Montana Cardiovascular Health Program requested data from MTDH on adults with disability for program planning activities.
- The Montana Tobacco Use Prevention Program uses the ACS-6 questions in the Quit Now Montana intake process.

- **Vital Statistics:** Consists of six vital events that are required to be reported and maintained by law; live births, deaths, fetal deaths, induced abortions, marriages, and divorces. Disability Data Resources

Disability and Health Data System (DHDS): is an online source of state-level data on adults with disabilities. Users can access information on six functional disability types, and more than 30 health topics among adults with or without disabilities, including smoking, obesity, heart disease, and diabetes. Users can customize data maps, charts, and tables, to see information about their state or region. They can identify health differences between adults with and without disabilities overall, and by age, sex, and race/ethnicity.
