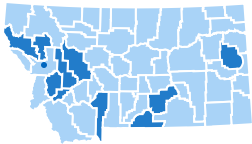


# The Montana Clean Indoor Air Act Protects Public Health

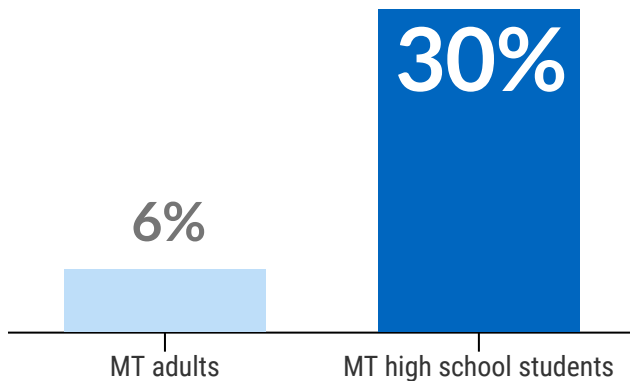
MT RESIDENTS are protected from e-cigarette aerosol.

The use of e-cigarettes among Montana's high school students is **5X** that of Montana adults. (1, 2)

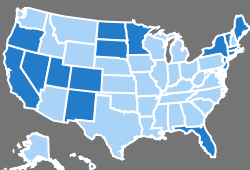


E-cigarette aerosol is not "harmless water vapor." The aerosol can contain harmful and potentially harmful substances, including:

- Nicotine
- Ultrafine particles that inhaled deep into the
- Toxic flavorings
- Volatile organic comp
- Cancer-causing chemicals
- Heavy metals such as nickel, tin, and lead (3)
