Instructions for the Affidavit for Collection of Personal Property of the Decedent Form

DEFINITIONS

Affiant: The person entitled to the property that was owned by the Decedent.

Decedent: The original owner of the property who has passed away.

Entity: Who is currently in possession of the Decedent's property.

AFFIANT SECTION

1. The Decedent's death date needs to match the date on the death certificate.

- 2. "Relation to the Decedent"
 - Examples: Daughter, Son, Nephew, Aunt, etc.
 - Be sure to include the appropriate pronoun (she/he/they) and verb tense ("is" if referring to a single individual or "are" if referring to multiple people).
- 3. Estates totaling more than \$100,000 (gross, not net) require the probate process and cannot be claimed using this form.
- 4. This form needs to be submitted a minimum of 30 days after the death of the Decedent.
- 5. The Affiant will not be considered the "Personal Representative" until the court appoints them as such.
- 6. Examples of property descriptions:
 - Checking or Savings Account Numbers
 - Itemized list of personal belongings and their serial numbers (furniture, instruments, etc.)
 - Itemized list of a jewelry collection

Be sure to include the address where the Decent's property is currently being held.

NOTARY SECTION

- The county and date need to reflect the location and date of notarization.
- You may complete the Affiant's name and the date if notarizing on the same day and location.
